Parish Mission Statement

On the Journey

+Today is the great feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. This is a time to celebrate – in a particularly focused way – what we celebrate and believe every time we gather at the altar for Mass. That is, we profess the Real Presence of the body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus in the elements of, and under the appearance of, bread and wine in the Eucharist.

This day we see a parallel between the people of Israel in their flight from Egypt and wandering in the desert to Jesus' feeding of us in his body and blood. At the end of their 40-year journey, Moses reminds the people of the faithfulness God showed them in providing what they needed, and He instructs them not to forget God who has guided them, sated their thirst, and fed their hunger.

The story of the people of Israel in the desert is our story. We, too, face unknown physical and spiritual dangers as we journey through our lives. Just as the manna kept the people of Israel alive through their journey, so, too, does the Eucharist keep our souls alive in the desert of our earthly life.

But the parallel with the manna in the desert is only partial. Our "manna," the Eucharist, is so much more than "food for the journey." Jesus tells us in the Gospel that if we eat his flesh and drink his blood, we will remain in Him and He in us, and that He will lead us to eternal life. The Eucharist we receive at Mass carries us throughout our weekly journeys, as Jesus remains in us. He is a steady presence, sharing in the good times and in the struggles of our lives.

On this great feast, as we receive Jesus in this most holy sacrament, let us pray for open, quiet hearts throughout the days to follow – hearts that will know of the presence of Jesus in the beauty around us, in the love of family and friends, in the kindness of colleagues, and even in the challenges that come our way. When we eat Jesus' Body and drink his Blood in the Eucharist, Jesus remains with us. Let us pray for an awareness of that presence so that we can BE the Body and Blood of Christ to others!

+Given the pandemic in which we are all going through, it is important for us to not overlook all the social unrest that surrounds us in our country. This is a time for all of us to pause some more and examine our attitudes and actions in how we put our beliefs as followers of Jesus Christ into our relationships with others. Am I prejudiced, have racial bigotry buried in my heart, or can I easily "look the other way" when instead, I should be looking to be Jesus and bring Jesus to all whom I meet on the journey? What am I called to do? How am I called to live my life? Serious, serious questions that we need to take to prayer and ask for wisdom and understanding

You've been asking...

1. **Why do I need to wear a face covering/mask?** Out of courtesy for all and to help prevent the transmission of disease, the CDC and the Archdiocese of Detroit recommend their use. Please make sure your mask covers your nose & mouth and you have it on prior to entering the church until you leave the church, with the exception of receiving communion..
2. **Why do I need to Register for weekend Mass?** You must register each weekend to ensure that we do not exceed the 25% capacity which we are currently allowed. Registration opens on Wednesday at Noon. There is a link in the parish email blast, on the parish website and on Facebook. If you do not receive the weekly emails, you can sign up for them on the parish website. For those without computer/internet access, you may call the parish office to reserve a seat.
3. **Why is there no wine at Mass?** To prevent the spread of disease, the Archdiocese has suspended the distribution of the Precious Blood at this time.
4. **When can I get into Church?** Doors open 30 Minutes before Mass on both weekdays & weekends. Doors are locked between Masses to allow for cleaning and sanitizing the Church.
5. **Where is the Holy Water?** Again, to prevent the spread of disease through communal dipping into the font, the Baptismal and Holy Water fonts are to remain dry until further notice.

Liturgical minute

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Today we observe the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This day was once called Corpus Christi, which is Latin for "Body of Christ." In the revised Lectionary the name for this day is expanded to reflect more completely our Eucharistic theology. This feast originated in France in the mid-thirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. This feast is celebrated on the Thursday following the Trinity Sunday or, as in the USA, on the Sunday following that feast.



For the next several weeks we are looking for volunteers to help with checking people in at each of the Masses and also to help fill in at Masses where we are short on ushers. If you would be willing to help or would like more information, please contact Nikki at the Parish Office.

Reminder

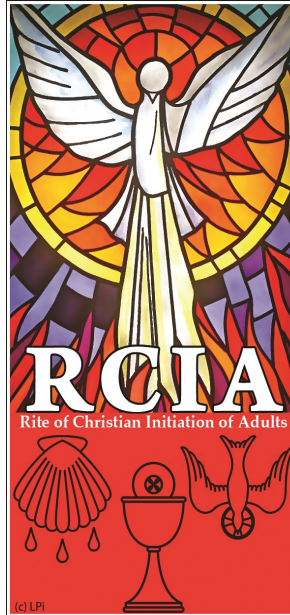
RCIA Sacraments of Initiation FINAL Celebration!

Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

The Scripture passages for today's Solemnity of Corpus Christi center on the profound mystery of bread and wine consecrated into the Body and Blood of Christ. The First Reading from the Book of Deuteronomy prefigures the Eucharist by describing the epic story of the Lord God's gift of manna to the Israelites. This manna nourishes them in the wilderness. Both St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthian community and the Gospel from St. John support the real, true, and substantial presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ in Holy Communion. Jesus especially stresses this fact in St. John's Gospel, proclaiming: *Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day.* Our Lord promises eternal life, and His words bring hope, comfort, strength, and peace, even in the most challenging times. By regularly partaking in the Eucharist, faith-filled stewards draw closer to Jesus. To satisfy your hunger for Christ, accept His invitation to attend Mass every Sunday and on weekdays, whenever possible, to receive Communion.



Living Bread

I love to bake for my family and friends. In the bread category, scones are my favorite, but I also like to bake cranberry nut bread, carrot muffins and banana bread. It's one way I can show hospitality.

God shows us hospitality by sharing the living bread with us: The body of His Son, Jesus Christ. The idea of eating Jesus body and drinking his blood seems gruesome, but when we acknowledge that we are experiencing the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, we can be very grateful for this awesome gift. It's not food for our stomachs, meeting our physical needs, but for our hearts and souls, satisfying our spiritual hunger. Whenever we attend Mass or read from the Bible, we gain a better understanding of this living bread.

Jesus gives us his body and blood so that we might have life eternal. That's far better than the most excellent scones!

Banana Bread

1 $\frac{3}{4}$ C flour

$\frac{1}{2}$ C shortening

$\frac{2}{3}$ C sugar

1 C mashed bananas

1t baking powder

2 eggs, slightly beaten

$\frac{1}{2}$ t salt

$\frac{1}{2}$ C chopped walnuts (opt)

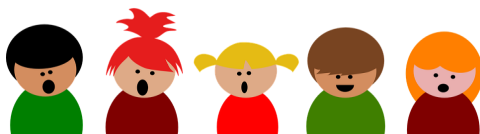
$\frac{1}{4}$ t baking soda

Preheat oven to 350*.

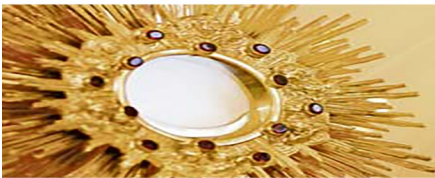
Mix together first 5 ingredients. Cut in shortening. Stir in bananas and eggs till blended. Add walnuts if desired. Pour into a greased and floured 9x5 loaf pan. Bake in preheated oven for 55 minutes, or until knife inserted comes out clean. Let cool 10 minutes and turn out of pan to finish cooling. Enjoy!

The Feast of Corpus Christi

Whole- Grain Soda Bread

Ingredients:

- 1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour
- 1 1/2 cups white flour
- 1 cup quick-cooking oats (uncooked)
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 tbsp baking powder
- 1 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 6 tbsp margarine or butter
- 1 1/2 cups golden raisins * optional
- 1 1/2 cups buttermilk

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350 Degrees Fahrenheit. And grease a cookie sheet. In a large bowl combine the dry ingredients. With a pastry blender or two knives cut in margarine or butter until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir in raisins. Slowly add buttermilk, just until the flour is moistened (dough will be sticky) Turn the dough on a well-floured surface, with floured hands knead 8-10 strokes to mix thoroughly. Shape dough into a ball and then place on a cookie sheet. Sprinkle the ball with flour. In the center of the ball cut 4-inch criss-cross, about 1/4 inch deep. Bake bread 1 hour or until an inserted toothpick comes out clean. remove from cookie sheet and cool on wire rack.

This recipe makes one loaf or about 12 servings.

In the making of this bread, its ingredients change form. Our hearts also transform by our communal prayer at Mass. This is what happens in the Eucharist. Through the action of the Holy Spirit, the "work of our hands" is transformed into the presence of Jesus Christ.

The Holy Spirit transforms not only the bread and wine but also the assembly. We too are the living Body of Christ.

8 Family of Parishes

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I write today with gratitude for the many blessings God has granted the Archdiocese of Detroit during our missionary journey. Six years ago, we asked God to send his Holy Spirit upon us in a New Pentecost, to fill us with an unshakable inner conviction of the truth of the Gospel and a love that compels us to share the good news with those around us. Two years later, through Synod '16 we received clarity that God wanted us to reclaim our Church's missionary identity and we set out with a promise to trust and follow him.

We began in earnest the work of a generation, to unleash the Gospel in southeast Michigan and beyond. Last year, we announced the next phase of this missionary movement, a plan to transform our parishes and schools, making them places where individuals and families can encounter Jesus anew, grow as disciples, and be equipped as witnesses of the Risen Christ.

This continues to be our mission today, even now in the midst of a historic pandemic. The current health and economic crises have disrupted our lives and the life of the Church. This new reality has exacerbated some of the challenges we were already facing. Even before the pandemic, we knew that the way we function in our parishes needed to change. In addition to the shortage of priests available to serve in our parishes and the shortage of vocations for future ordinations, the parish structures we inherited served our mission well in the past, but they needed to be renewed and aligned for mission.

And so, in prayer and in consultation with others, I've discerned that now is the time to respond in faith to the challenges we face and to take the necessary steps to better equip our parish communities for mission. Over the next two years, parishes in the Archdiocese of Detroit will join together to form new groupings called "families of parishes." These groups – these families – of three to six parishes will work together and share human and material resources to further advance our shared mission. This new model will allow *groups* of priests, deacons, and lay staff to better share their gifts and talents with their entire parish *families*.

We are not the same diocese we were six years ago when we began this journey. God has been at work in us, in our communities, in our parishes, and in our schools. We have learned to be more docile to the Holy Spirit. We have learned to walk with apostolic boldness and confidence in God. We are committed to working in a spirit of innovation and collaboration. And most importantly, we have resolved to place Christ and his mission above all else.

Over the next several months, groups of clergy and lay faithful will help me discern the leadership and governance structure of the families of parishes and the ways in which this new structure will help all our parishes become vibrant posts of missionary activity. At Advent, my hope is to announce the groups of parishes that will form each family, with the first of them expected to begin to function as a family in July of 2021.

I invite you to visit the website www.familiesofparishes.org to learn more about this process and to sign up for updates. Please join me in praying for this very important step in the life and mission of our local Church. Let us give thanks to God ahead of time for the great work he is doing in our midst. God is with us. He has given us his Holy Spirit as the initiator, guide, and driving force of our mission.

Blessed Solanus Casey, Detroit's own priest, pray for us. Our Lady of Lourdes, protector of the sick, pray for us. And dear St. Anne, patron of our Archdiocese, pray for us.

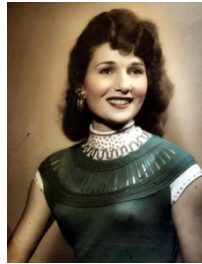
