On the Journey

+We spend a lot of time and effort being afraid. Some fear a past they cannot change or a future they cannot predict. Others fear what people are thinking or saying about them. There is fear of heights, the dark, spiders, loneliness, etc. But one of the constant messages of Scripture is, "fear not!" And paying attention to why we are not to be afraid is an exercise in spiritual maturity.

Jeremiah exemplifies that today in our first reading. He had good reason to fear — if not death, at least great harm to himself. As a prophet who lived some six centuries before Jesus, Jeremiah's prophecy was that the Israelite's careless faithlessness was to blame for their exile to Babylon, which is present-day Iraq. This idea was roundly rejected by his audience, and because the people despised the message, they wanted to *take [their] vengeance on him*.

In the face of such evil, however, the prophet showed no fear, choosing instead to sing to the Lord, praise the Lord, for He has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked. If only we could be so brave when our enemies gather at the gate!

We can be, if we open our hearts to the words of Jesus. He tells us to *fear no one* and nothing. If we truly believe that God has created all things, even the birds of the sky and fish in the seas, then surely He has not lost sight of us in our struggles. *You are worth more than many sparrows*, Jesus says. For some, knowing that God has counted all the hairs on our head might be disconcerting, but for others, still it offers great comfort – to know that God is so intimately involved with every detail of even the smallest and seemingly insignificant parts of his creation.

In the letter to the Romans, Saint Paul echoes Christ's message of determination and confidence. For it is through Christ, who conquers sin and death, that we can share in his victory over not just mortal death, but the death of our own fears, faults, and failings. God's *gracious gift of the one man Jesus Christ* is his grace *overflowing for the many*. The reign of death from Adam to Moses is ended and the kingdom of God and the hope of heaven has taken its place.

We live in a world that is often times hostile to the Gospel, and we all have to face the daily burdens of life with all its challenges. But Christ's presence among us — God's grace overflowing — is there to give us strength, courage, and fortitude. Through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, we have the ability to pray for these gifts, that we might stand up not only to defend the faith, but to be strong in the face of any obstacles. Our efforts to *unleash the Gospel* are meant to re-awaken us to the workings of the Holy Spirit in our life of faith and realize the call we each have received through Baptism to spread the Gospel in our lives — in ways both big and small, to the one or two around us as well as to the communities in which we live.

What I am asking is that everyone be as generous as possible when the CSA takes place so that we can work together at paying off our new facility. More to come later on this; I think to alleviate some of the burden on the parishes, you will see more being handled through the Archdiocese, but as to what extent is not yet known. Please start contemplating how you might be able to help us with this effort!

+While Fr. Tom's time with us gets closer to conclusion, we keep him in special prayers – wishing him the best in his new assignment, and in thanksgiving for all that he has done for us, especially over these last couple of months during my illness/recovery mode. While we cannot host a formal farewell, and as I've mentioned to Fr. Tom, we will work at planning something in the fall when, hopefully, we can gather. We'll invite him back to celebrate and see how he is doing. Thank you, Fr. Tom!

+As some may know or recall, this coming Wednesday, June 24th, is the 25th anniversary of my priesthood ordination. Where has all that time gone? There had been a committee working on a celebration with the parish back earlier this year, but all that came to a halt given the pandemic crisis we have surrounding us. Again, we will try to do something later in the year to mark my silver jubilee – and it's something I would want all of you to participate in! As for now, please keep me – and all priests – in your special prayers on Wednesday as I recall the day, the joys, the blessings, the graces that were all there some 25 years ago. May this wonderful calling to serve the Lord in this most special way continue to be part of the next chapters of my life! I give thanks to

Jesus Christ for the blessings bestowed upon me to help in this ministry. And let us all remember to pray for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life!

INGREDIENTS

- 1 tablespoon ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon ground white pepper
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 teaspoon ground jalapeno pepper, optional
- 2 tablespoon chili powder
- 2 tablespoon ground cumin
- 1 tablespoon garlic powder
- 1 tablespoon ground oregano
- 2 tablespoons sweet paprika
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- 1 teaspoon dry mustard
- 1 tablespoon celery salt
- 1 tablespoon salt

INSTRUCTIONS

Combine all ingredients in a bowl. Store in an air tight container.
Use on beef, chicken and pork.

Rub on meat and refrigerate at least 2 hours before cooking.

U.S. Catholic Bishops Speak Out Against Racism

Commenting on the death of George Floyd and the subsequent protests across the United States, the Catholic bishops have called for greater action against racism. Pope Francis expressed solidarity with the U.S. bishops, urging Catholics not to turn a blind eye to racism or exclusion in society. Two important actions expressed in the statements from the U.S. bishops are 1) listening to those who have historically been disenfranchised and 2) peacefully calling out injustice:

"We should all understand that the protests we are seeing in our cities reflect the justified frustration and anger of millions of our brothers and sisters who even today experience humiliation, indignity, and unequal opportunity only because of their race or the color of their skin. It should not be this way in America. Racism has been tolerated for far too long in our way of life. It is true what Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. said, that riots are the language of the unheard. We should be doing a lot of listening right now. This time, we should not fail to hear what people are saying through their pain. We need to finally root out the racial injustice that still infects too many areas of American society. But the violence of recent nights is self-destructive and self-defeating. Nothing is gained by violence and so much is lost...We should honor the sacrifice of [George Floyd's] life by removing racism and hate from our hearts and renewing our commitment to fulfill our nation's sacred promise - to be a beloved community of life, liberty, and equality for all."
