On the Journey

+Starting a little different this week, I want to mention that this is Fr. Tom's last weekend with us. After completing his three-year assignment, I want to personally, publicly, and prayerfully thank him for his dedication to his priestly ministry with us over this time! As I stated in last week's article, we will work at having him return for a little more formal farewell; hopefully by or in the fall, we will have conditions that give rise to us hosting something for everyone to stop by and extend their wishes to Fr. Tom in his new assignment! Let us remember to pray for all the priests and parishes who are going through transitions with their priests this week; July 1 is the primary start day for priests going out to new assignments. As we say good-bye to Fr. Tom, we say hello next week to Fr. Craig!

+This weekend, in our Scriptures, we hear part of Jesus' very candid teaching on the importance and demands of discipleship. As He sends the Apostles out to preach, He reminds them that they can expect hardship and a variety of responses to their preaching. Yet they are not to be afraid of whatever might happen, for they will never be without his care and love.

What Jesus is saying is that we must be "all-in" in our response to Him. If we think about it, it makes perfect sense: whatever one invests the most of oneself in, brings the greatest return. Therefore, those who invest in their relationship with Christ will receive a prophet's rewards. Like a frame that gives definition, strength, and shape to a building, discipleship gives the same to our lives. But we must choose that frame – God will never impose it upon us.

Today, we hear about the woman from Shunem who sought to serve God by assisting his servant. Her generosity did not go unnoticed, but rather is rewarded with her deepest wish – a child.

Paul reminds us that we are each baptized in Christ – called by God just as the woman from Shunem was called by Elisha and the disciples were called by Jesus. That call emanating from the very heart of God to follow Jesus and to take up our cross is at the heart of our baptismal identity.

And so we are challenged to reflect on how we have accepted this call. Are we even aware of what our baptism asks of us, what "demands" it places upon us? Do we ever think about the responsibilities that come with being a disciple of Jesus? Maybe some think that it's only a one-way street and we are just recipients of God's blessings and graces. But if we are indeed serious about our relationship with Christ, then we must be open to allowing it to grow and deepen. We will come to learn that we have to put the graces and blessings into action and practice if we are a true follower of the Lord. Not always easy, for sure, but we are reminded that we are never alone in responding to this call.

Making the choice to follow Jesus, and then living it fully, can be difficult and challenging – even Christ acknowledges this. But there is reward. When we put God first, when we serve God before all else, we are promised eternal life with Him.

My sisters and brothers, let that promise inspire and strengthen our commitment to be faithful as God is always faithful. And may the grace of the Eucharist be the frame upon which we build our lives!

- +The Parish Office has "re-opened" for business, to a certain extent. We ask that you follow the guidelines that will be communicated. Hours will be with some cut backs for now; you must make an appointment to come in. You MUST wear a mask, and we're practicing social distancing still! With staff back in regularly, you might still find it easier to handle business over the phone, but know that there will be someone there to actually speak to and respond to your inquiry. (Welcome back, Gayle!)
- +We have also worked out a First Communion schedule, and parents involved will be getting a letter soon, if you have not yet received it by now. Dates are in August and September (to give time for some planning), but we will also accommodate other requests for celebrations at some Sunday or even a weekday mass. Confirmation celebrations are still being reviewed, so no firm dates yet, but most likely in November. We are trying to examine how we can handle the retreat days and interviews.
- +I ask that you please pay attention to and follow guidelines/directives issued by the state, Archdiocese and parish in attending functions here at the parish. Wear a mask; keep distances. I often see, after mass, groups gathering, almost "huddling" around afterwards to talk. Maybe they're families/related, so there is not so much concern. But please, let's work together to keep us all healthy!
- +As some maybe are aware, this past Wednesday, June 24th, was the 25th anniversary of my priesthood ordination. As I indicated last weekend, where has the time gone? I give thanks and praise to God for the opportunity to offer myself in priestly ministry/ service to Him and the Church. My thanks for all the cards and remembrances of this most special day in my life! Continue to pray for me....and for all priests, deacons and religious. Pray that there be a greater response to the call from the Lord to the priesthood and religious life! May St. John Vianney offer us his guidance and intercessions to all!
- +Next weekend includes the July 4th holiday on Saturday. As such, the parish offices will only be open on Friday only until NOON in celebration of the holiday. Then, there will be a morning mass on Saturday, July 4th at 9 a.m. in the church. Regular weekday mass guidelines are to be followed.
- +Your on-going prayers are greatly appreciated, and those notes and cards you send support my hope that I will get through this challenging period of my life. I look forward to seeing you all soon!


Stratford Trip Refunds:

In the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, many Michigan families are hurting financially. However,

legislation to expand the payday lending system in this state is NOT the answer. If passed, House Bill 5097 would allow payday lenders to offer loans of up to \$2,500 from the current limit of \$600. Michigan Catholic Conference (MCC) has continually spoken out against the measure, as it charges borrowers an exorbitant 132 annual percentage rate, lacks adequate consumer protections, and traps Michiganders in a dangerous cycle of debt.

While House Bill 5097 recently passed the Michigan House of Representatives, it only did so by a narrow margin. Your email and phone messages made a difference, and MCC is grateful for your quick action! Now that the measure has been sent over to the Senate Regulatory Reform Committee, MCC is asking you to keep speaking out on this issue. Your continued advocacy is needed in order to stop HB 5097 in the Michigan Senate.


