### On the Journey

+Ask something of me, God says to Solomon today, and I will give it to you. God gives Solomon an incredible gift - the freedom to have exactly what he asks for. And with that freedom, Solomon asks for something that pleases God: he asks for an understanding heart. Solomon, who knows the ways of God and is faithful to Him, is already wise in his own ways. Yet rather than increase his own stature, he seeks to honor God as the source of that wisdom. He gives glory to God by acknowledging his reliance upon Him at all times and in all situations.

A similar expression of freedom is exhibited by the individuals in today's Gospel parables. Here, the freedom is found in the desire to experience the kingdom of heaven. There's a sort of irony present, though. In a certain sense, the person who digs for the treasure *already owned* the treasure underneath his feet. Likewise, the merchant who buys the pearl of great price already had the wealth with which to purchase it. Both of these parables teach us that we desire the kingdom of heaven because we already know it. We find it in Jesus Christ, who is the way, and we seek more of it by following Him.

The wise youth, in his wisdom, asks God for wisdom. A person uses treasure to purchase a different treasure. A pearl merchant sells pearls to buy a pearl. Christ's parables are clearly *not* about making good business deals. Jesus, rather, teaches that the kingdom of heaven is as much an encounter as it is a goal. The faithful *experience* God's kingdom in the action of living our lives.

It takes wisdom to seek wisdom in the same way that it takes pearls to buy a pearl. God is present in all of this. For we who love God, all things, every day, work together for the good, as Saint Paul says. Each moment of our work and leisure, our joys and even in our sorrows, every moment is its own reward when we operate with the understanding of the nearness of the Kingdom. Jesus is the way to heaven, and He is here – *now*.

May God grant us his wisdom to know his nearness each and every moment of each and every day! May we ask for and accept this gift, and put it to the good use for which God intended!

+A situation came up last week in which a person wanted to get into the church to pray before the Blessed Sacrament. At the time of day it occurred, the church was locked (I am assuming it was around 1 p.m. or so). Morning mass had been celebrated, the church had been sanitized, and so it was buttoned up for the day. After interacting with this parishioner, I began to think of what we could do to keep the building open a bit longer to accommodate such need by some people to "pray in church."

After much discussion, staff offered suggestions, and we are going to keep the church unlocked and open until 2 p.m. Monday through Friday for this private prayer. Then at 2 p.m., the maintenance staff will lock it up and go through the laborious process of deep cleaning the facility (church proper, bathrooms, vestry, doorways & handles, etc.) In this way, there will be some additional time for prayer.

**PLEASE NOTE:** should there be a funeral, or wedding, or some other liturgical event scheduled, there may have to be a locking of doors that is NOT according to this “schedule.” I cannot predict when that will happen, but it needs to be done to allow for the cleaning we believe to be necessary. So please don’t be upset with locked doors at 10:30 a.m. after daily mass and prior to a funeral coming in at noon.

Some have asked how “other parishes” manage to keep their places open “all the time.” Well, there are many who are locked down more than we after surveying parishes in surrounding area. And I am not responsible for their cleaning schedules, so I can only do what we think best to keep our St. Andrew facility as safe and clean as possible. I hope this works out for our community and meets some of the demands we have recently had. Know that should the government demand we go back to an earlier phase to deal with an increasing number of Covid19 cases, we will cooperate and fulfill the guidelines issued. Folks, we all have to do our parts in trying to get this pandemic under control; pray and please do your share to surmount this challenging crisis in our state, country and world!

You will see elsewhere in the bulletin and on the website the timing for this additional hours of “operation.” Thank you for your cooperation!

+Some of you might have seen workers on the rectory roof this past week; *no, we are not adding another level to the building to rent out!* It was discovered in cleaning out the gutters that there are parts of the roof that had started to seriously deteriorate – actually, rot – over time by the roof edges. The company came in and tore off some shingles and replaced the wood base and then had to put shingles back on. This was on the north side of the rectory, but further review showed some of the same type of deterioration on the south (church) side of the roof. Further work will need to be done there.

We have looked for records in the office, telling us when the last “new” roof of shingles went on the building, but could not find any information. There are two layers, so replacing the entire roof with new shingles will mean a tear-off of the old. When it rains it pours! The rectory, like the church building proper, is 50 years old. So at this time, we are just making repairs and will have to discern when we can afford to redo the entire roof.

+We have basically finished with our “local” CSA brochure for our 2020 appeal and have already sent it out to the printers. You should be receiving it over the next week or so. I ask you to PLEASE BE GENEROUS AS YOU HAVE BEEN IN THE PAST! Your gift of treasure has helped up so far to keep things “above water” during this crisis, and now I ask for your assistance in helping me (I’ve made my donation already!!) meet and EXCEED our target for the year. I hope we can do something like we’ve done these last two years, in more than doubling our target and helping to address the loan on our new facilities. WON’T YOU PLEASE HELP?

+My prayerful gratitude continues for your notes, cards, meals, and most importantly your prayerful support for my recovery to full and good health, so that I may return to sacramental ministry here at the parish. While I might be getting my “office homework” done, it’s the priestly functions that I sure do miss, so keep those prayers going for me!

+May you all try to enjoy this middle of summer, thanking the good Lord for all the many gifts bestowed upon each of us and our families! May the Spirit guard and guide you and keep you safe!

### Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today’s Gospel reading from the evangelist St. Matthew, Jesus’ parables describe the Kingdom of Heaven. In the first parable, Jesus tells of a man who finds a buried treasure; in the second, a merchant searches and finds a valuable pearl. In both stories, the men sell everything to buy these treasures. Through these parables, we learn to aspire to love God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, as well as our neighbor. This love graces us in holiness, in our attempt to strive for the treasure of heaven. King Solomon, in the First Book of Kings, asks God for an *understanding heart* instead of wealth. Faith-filled stewards know the path to eternal salvation is not easy. But through evangelization efforts expressed through stewardship, we deepen our discipleship in Christ and increase our chances of gaining eternal life. For examples of those who made Jesus personal in their lives, read the inspiring stories of our saints and pray to God through them for wisdom and guidance.

Has someone asked you about your faith, inquired about being baptized, or completing their Sacraments, or was baptized in another faith but would like to learn more about the Catholic Church? Do you know someone who has an interest in becoming a Catholic?


The decision to become a member of the Catholic faith is often fostered by invitation by a member of our faith community. This means you! By our Baptism we are all called into missionary discipleship, and therefore, are in a key position to invite others into our faith journey. This is how we "Unleash the Gospel"!

The process known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process of prayer, learning, and joining with others who feel the Spirit of God nudging them to the Catholic Faith. Within the RCIA process are those adults who have never been baptized those who have been baptized in another faith, or Baptized Catholic but have not completed their initiation (have not celebrated First Eucharist or Confirmation).

In 2019, the U.S. bishops approved a new guidance on capital punishment, saying that **"the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person"** (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2267).


In 2015, Pope Francis spoke out against the practice, recognizing that it does not provide victims with justice **"but rather foments revenge."** Sadly, in spite of this reality, the Administration has resumed federal executions for the first time in seventeen years. Attorney General William Barr scheduled four executions for death row inmates this month. Three have already taken place. People of faith have the opportunity to remind society that the value of the human person is not destroyed when a crime is committed.


