On the Journey

+God's thoughts and generosity exceed our ability to understand the actions that God takes. Isaiah tells us that God's ways are above our ways and his thoughts are above our thoughts.

As an example, the parable about the landowner's decision to pay all his workers the same wage no matter how long they worked in his vineyard can be confusing. It seems to offend our sense of fairness

But Jesus turns our perspective upside down when the landowner asks, *Am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?* Jesus' focus on the landowner – his generosity in paying the workers who only found the job at his vineyard at the last minute – draws our focus to God.

God is that generous landowner, who welcomes people to his vineyard until the very last moment. For God, it is never too late for people to come to Him and seek to serve Him and do his will. God loves all of us as his children, and his mercy extends beyond our own conceptions of place and time.

As we go about our day, let us seek God and remember his generosity to us, his love and mercy that are so high above us that we cannot even fathom them. And no matter when we entered his vineyard, let us thank God for the opportunity to work for Him!

+Our parish will participate in the national day of prayer and fasting as suggested by the Acts XXIX Apostolate in light of pausing from our routine schedules and praying for a conversion of our hearts — to be more Christ-like in our daily actions. On Thursday, September 24th, everyone is invited to fast up to dinner time and join in prayer during the course of that day. Try to make it to our 9 a.m. morning mass which will be followed by quiet prayer and Eucharistic adoration until 10:30 a.m. that day. Let us all humble ourselves before the Lord and ask for his mercy and healing powers to come over us as individuals, building a community in the image in which God wants us to live!

+This weekend we recognize and thank all our catechists for their willingness to share their faith in Jesus Christ with our young people! Not only does this cover our own Religious Formation program, but includes our own HFRS as well as our Youth Group activities. To come to know the Lord is an important part of our "growing up" phase of life; it is important to establish a firm foundation upon which to build as we all grow older. So on this Catechetical Sunday, let us pray for all those who serve in the role of catechists and help with the faith formation of our youth. May you be blessed many times over for the sacrifices you make in living out this particular calling! We as parents, guardians, and the parish community at large offer you our prayerful gratitude! 

+Thank you to all who have come forward and made their pledge/donation to our 2020 CSA! As of my writing on Monday afternoon, it looks like we have just made our target of \$302,657 (though that is both pledges as well paid donations; not all of that target has been collected yet). My prayerful gratitude to all who have made the sacrifice in giving!

Please remember – just because we made the target doesn't mean everyone else is "off the hook"! Our use of CSA has been that the "over-target" amount will be used, in our case



As I said on Sunday at the noon mass, a complex that has structures over 50 years old will bound to be in need of some major maintenance/repair. For example, in the last couple weeks, we discovered a drain problem associated with the PC building; hence all the digging you see going on at the south side of the complex, next to the city park. This will generate a bill in excess of \$30K for all the work. Your generosity in making an extra generous pledge to CSA will be a major help in addressing these "surprise" issues that hit our budget during the year.

+I can't tell you how my infusion treatment went yet – because I haven't had it yet! But I feel the power of many prayers being offered for me – so I thank you sincerely for your support!

+Through the patronage of St. Andrew, may we all be kept safe during this time of pandemic. (So far, all is well at Holy Family Regional School! They continue to work hard on keeping things safe and clean for students as well as the staff!) May our Mother Mary and Blessed Solanus continue their watchful eye on all of us here! 
