On the Journey

+The Gospel passage we hear this weekend is one which most of us can recall. Two sons are ordered by their father to *go out and work in the vineyard*. This is not an unreasonable request. Presumably, the father owns the vineyard and therefore the sons have a stake in its success. It is to their benefit, and is their duty, to obey.

We know that the first one says he will not, but then does go out to the field. The second one says he will, but then does not. That the first son is the one who actually does the will of God sets the stage for the real rhetorical "punch" of Jesus' message. Speaking to the chief priests and elders of the people, Jesus says to them, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you.

These words are meant to get their attention, obviously, for as religious leaders, they would have seen themselves as both morally and socially superior to tax collectors and prostitutes. They also reflect something found in the words of the prophet *Ezekiel* as he relays the Lord's message to his people: *When someone virtuous turns away from virtue to commit iniquity*[he dies]. *But if he turns from the wickedness he has committed, he does what is right and just, he shall preserve his life.*

Everyone has a choice as to how to act – just like the sons in the parable; just like the chief priests and elders; just like the tax collectors and prostitutes. And the interesting thing about these words in Ezekiel is that the Lord is acknowledging not just those who repent and follow God's way, but also those who "turn from virtue to sin." This is a good description of the second son – and likely the religious leaders in this story – as their words signify obedience and piety, while their actions say otherwise.

Jesus is celebrating God's mercy, and his compassion upon those tax collectors and prostitutes (and others) who initially rejected God in making their life choices, but who eventually turned away from sin to life. He is also pointing out that virtue — in this case, the status and learning of the religious leaders — does not make them immune to disobedience and unrighteous. Understanding God's will, committing to it and doing it, are what bring life.

In our humanity, we know that we will at times turn away from seeking God – but let's strive to make those times few and far in-between the way we seek to live our daily lives and unleash the Gospel!

+For those enrolled in our Religious Formation program, we had hoped to be able to offer both in-classroom sessions as well as an "at-home" program. After much review and consideration, we decided last week to delay the offering of "live" sessions, given the current state of affairs and some difficulties in managing the logistics of putting on the program. So, there will be NO "in-class" Religious (continued on page 3)

Formation sessions this fall (and until further notice). We will offer a great at-home program that will, hopefully not just be a good experience for our young students, but will also serve to provide a good "review" for parents and grandparents who might take on this role of catechist for your children. More information will be coming from our Religious Formation office should you have questions.


- +On Thursday of this past week, we joined with many other parishes in a National Day of Prayer and Fasting an effort to help us bring about more conversion in our lives so that we may truly seek God's will and put it into practice in our daily routines. Thanks to everyone who joined in at Mass or the time of quiet prayer/Eucharistic adoration which followed.
- +Around the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, we typically offer a little prayer service for the blessing of animals. We will try to keep this tradition going this year so on Saturday, October 3, at 10:30 a.m., we will do the blessing around the bell tower on the mall leading up to the church. Masks are required, and we ask that you keep yourselves "socially distant" while gathering.
- +Our 2020 CSA efforts are coming along quite well at present. We have achieved our target of \$302,657 through the generosity of many parish families. At this point, it is not all collected, but is made up of pledges as well as donations. We have surpassed the target at this point by \$39,000, putting us into the "bonus round" as I like to say BUT please remember the additional monies coming in will be put toward our building construction loan from the Archdiocese. It would be great if we could at least double the targeted amount. That amount, applied to the principal balance of the loan, would save us over \$16,000 in interest expenses annually!

I kindly ask – if you have not yet committed to our 2020 CSA, please make your pledge today so that we can save monies over the long term of repayment (10 years, as it stands at the beginning of the project/loan life). Know of my prayerful gratitude!

- +We continue to work on the "Family of Parishes" project throughout the Archdiocese. This coming-together of parishes will be of help in providing many and more opportunities to grow in our faith while addressing faith formation needs and opportunities within the parishes that make up each of the "families." The pastors of our Pontiac vicariate had a meeting this past Wednesday to further examine the "groupings" of parishes and see what would make the most sense. I will continue to keep you posted as we move forward in this long-term effort.
- +I thank you for your prayers, especially with my new infusion treatment which started last week. I will be going again this coming Tuesday. It went quite smoothly, more so than I expected, with no adverse reactions. Please keep me in prayer, that I may experience the healing grace of God as I proceed with these treatments!
- +May we continue to become the "grateful" people that we are all called to be! I look forward to seeing you in church and around the complex!

Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Scripture readings from the Prophet Ezekiel and the evangelist St. Matthew teach us about repentance from sin. Communicating through Ezekiel, God reminds us that everyone is accountable for their sins. Those who atone for their sins will save their lives. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of two sons invited to work in their father's vineyard. The first agrees to work but then fails to show up. The second son declines but later repents and does his father's will. As repentant stewards, we recognize our fallen nature and know that sin blocks our relationship with Christ. In St. Paul's Letter to the Philippian community, he urges humility and love in dealing with one another. Jesus' healing mercy and forgiving grace is available for the contrite, repentant sinner through the Sacrament of Penance. Find forgiveness and peace through this beautiful sacrament and make a habit of going to confession regularly.

The Season of Creation

We are in the Season of Creation, celebrated throughout the month of September. It lasts until Oct. 4, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, patron saint of animals, ecology and the environment. During this time we are invited to be especially mindful of how we relate to God's creation and use its resources.

In his "World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation" address on Sept. 1, 2019, Pope Francis calls us to pray, reflect, and act. He asks that we let our prayer be inspired by the "symphony of creation," "reflect on our lifestyles," and "undertake prophetic actions" to care for the planet. He states, "The young remind us that the earth is not a possession to be squandered, but an inheritance to be handed down. They remind us that hope for tomorrow is not a noble sentiment, but a task calling for concrete actions here and now."

Children can be encouraged to pray for the environment by going outside and counting the trees in the yard, and thanking God for them. They can ponder how they use the world's resources. Then take action to make small changes that add up to big changes, such as recycling and using less water in daily tasks.

Care for yourself and one another. We are all works of art, created by God. And don't forget your beloved animals. They are part of creation, too. Bring them to the pet blessing this Saturday, Oct. 3 at 10:30am at the bell tower. They will get a blessing and perhaps a treat!

Caring for creation in all its forms, not only this month but throughout the year, will ensure that our world will be healthy for future generations.
