On the Journey

+In writing to the Romans, St. Paul says that the *one who loves another has fulfilled the law*. He is reiterating the teaching of Christ, indeed, his *greatest commandment*. The commandment to love – inclusive of one another, oneself, and God – is found in all four of the Gospels.

Jesus is the love of God made flesh. He came *out* of love *for* love. He came to save us, to make us whole again, to make us holy. The love that Jesus commands, and that Jesus lives, is not a set of warm or fuzzy feelings. It is a profound willing of our good, and a selfless desire that we be who we are made to be.

This is the love we also are commanded to live. We are asked to will – to want, to seek, to make happen – the good of those God puts around us. This is not always easy, and it is not always pleasant. We see examples of this in both the reading from Ezekiel and in our gospel from Matthew.

The Lord tells the prophet Ezekiel that he will be held responsible for the death of the wicked if he does not *speak out to dissuade* him. In the Gospel, then, Jesus gives instructions on how we should correct those who sin against us; how to raise our voices against wickedness, speaking out and speaking up when we see others living apart from God. To do so is to love, and it is a commandment.

Yet, before this clarion call leads us too far, we must remember what is perhaps the most uncomfortable reality of this law of love. Jesus makes it clear that we are not asked to do this from afar – like from behind computer screens or behind backs – but one-on-one at first and face to face when possible. We are called to be in relationship – to know of this sin in the first place because it is "against us" -because we are close.

Call it tough love, accountability, charitable or fraternal correction, or even speaking the truth in love, as St. Paul says elsewhere (Ephesians 4:15). It is a love that truly desires the good of the other, and will intervene out of love for the sake of another's salvation – just as the Father did in sending his Son.

Ultimately, the one who chooses evil over good has forged his own path toward death. But in following the command to love one another, we can help others find the path toward life. And Christ, who is present in the Eucharist, gives us the grace to do just that. So let us be responsive to our baptismal calling to love by *unleashing the Gospel* each and every day of our lives and putting it into a loving practice in our dealings with each other!

+Happy Labor Day weekend to everyone! May the gift of work in our lives contribute to the good of not only ourselves and our families, but to the overall wellbeing of society. Mass on Monday will be at its usual time, 9 a.m. However, after



mass, the church will be cleaned and locked, so we can give the maintenance crew some time to rest and relax on the holiday!

- +Speaking of daily mass, I just ask that everyone be careful in the parking lot, especially during this time when the students for HFRS are not able to arrive on a bus, but must be dropped off in parents' automobiles. Please no speeding in the parking lots, or down one of the streets that leads to our property; we have already had complaints from the neighbors! Safety is important for all of us, so please follow the directions set up for use of the lots, for mass as well as for school drop-off/pick-up.
- +Speaking of students, we will have another celebration for groups of students who have been anxiously waiting to make their first Holy Communion next Saturday, September 12, at 10 a.m. and again at 2 p.m. This will probably get us "caught up" on this important milestone of the one of the Sacraments of Initiation for (primarily) our second graders. We welcome you all to the Table of the Lord! May you all grow closer to Jesus through his coming to you in this most special sacrament!
- +As we progress with our 2020 CSA efforts, many received a letter from Archbishop Vigneron this past week (or if not, probably in the coming week), regarding the appeal. Remember, we as a parish opted to start our appeal with our own letter and brochure (since it was virtually ready to go back at the end of March), and then take advantage of ONE of the mailings from the Archdiocese as a follow-up. So far, we have received donations/pledges of \$247,838 against our target of \$302,657. First, it would be great if we could meet our goal in the next week or two, so we can move into what I like to refer to as the "bonus round," where all collected funds over the target will be used to help pay for our new building additions and campus upgrades. To those who have already given, I offer my sincere, prayerful gratitude! If you have not yet made your commitment, please consider joining us in supporting our parish with all the work that has been done! God bless all of you!
- +Since some parishioners have asked me to clarify the matters, let me try to do so briefly here in my article. Some individuals between 1986 and 1999 were "incorrectly" baptized by Deacon Mark Springer of the archdiocese (he was stationed at St. Anastasia Parish) because of the wording that was used in the celebration of Baptism. Only recently because of the case of Fr. Matthew Hood has this come to light. (His situation and the corrective journey Fr. Matt had to take were made known in the papers and various newscasts.) It is too complex to go through all the details here, but if anyone now at St. Andrew had "attempted" to be baptized by Deacon Mark Springer between 1986 through 1999, or "attempted" to be married or confirmed by Fr. Matthew Hood in the last few years (prior to August 17, 2020), please contact either Fr. Craig or myself to help review your situation and see if there is any "corrective" actions that need to take place.
- +I continue to thank you all very much for your prayers and other support during my illness/time of rehabilitation these past months! While I am still not back 100%, I have been able to carry on with a good amount of my regular work load, including even doing noon mass last Sunday! Please continue with your prayers, as the doctors have yet to decide what the next course of action will be for me!
- +Through the intercession of Our Lady, her mother and our Detroit patroness, St. Anne, and Blessed Solanus Casey, may we come to experience safety and good health from the pandemic that confronts us all and may it come to a conclusion in our world! God bless and keep you in the palms of his hands! Looking forward to seeing you more in the coming weeks!


Saint of the Day

Saint Peter Claver September 9

A native of Spain, St. Peter Claver was a Jesuit missionary who spent his life in the service of African slaves brought against their will to South America during the 17th century. Born into a farming family in the Spanish region of Catalonia during 1581, he studied at the University of Barcelona, and joined the Jesuits as a novice at the age of 20 eventually ordained as a priest.

In 1610, Peter Claver arrived in Cartagena, a port city in presentday Colombia. Cartagena was a chief center for slave trade. Ten thousand slaves poured into the port each year. Although the

practice of slave-trading was condemned by Pope Paul III and later labeled "supreme villainy" by Pope Pius IX, it continued to flourish.



As soon as a slave ship entered the port, Peter Claver moved into its infested hold to minister to the ill-treated and exhausted passengers giving them medicines, food and water. With the help of interpreters he gave basic instructions and assured his brothers and sisters of their human dignity and God's love. During the 40 years of his ministry, he instructed and baptized an estimated 300,000 slaves.

Fr. Claver's apostolate extended beyond his care for slaves. In keeping with his vow of "slavery," Peter survived on minimal amounts of food and sleep. He preached in the city square, gave missions to sailors and traders as well as country missions, during which he avoided, when possible, the hospitality of the planters and owners and lodged in the slave quarters instead.

After four years of sickness, Claver died on September 8, 1654. Peter Claver was canonized in 1888, and Pope Leo XIII declared him the worldwide patron of missionary work among black slaves.
