On the Journey

+In every culture, food is an essential part of celebrations – from the wedding banquet to the Christmas meal. As families and friends we gather around the table, not just out of necessity, but because the time spent together there has emotional, spiritual and human meaning. (That's one of the reasons why we so miss some of these larger gatherings during this time of pandemic; we miss out on the sharing and 'community' that goes on in such gatherings.) At the table, a deeper sense of unity among all is present; food unites as much as nourishes. So we can understand why food, and the sharing of it, is to present throughout Scripture.

We see that image in today's readings from the great banquet foretold by Isaiah with its *rich food and choice wines*, to the wedding feast in the Gospel. Even Paul hints at it by referring to being *well fed* and *living in abundance*. Added to this, the beloved Psalm 23, with its table spread and its overflowing cup, gives us a glimpse of what the fullness of the Kingdom will be like – a great feast, hosted by the Lord, where everyone has a place and is gathered not just to be fed but to celebrate and find peace.

It makes sense that Jesus chooses this image to flesh out his teachings on the Kingdom. It would clearly have resonated with his audience, even if some, like the chief priest and elders, failed to understand it fully.

Like many, they failed to understand that while God invites all to his banquet, that invitation must be accepted. We respond by the way we live our lives. As the parable unfolds, some responses are clearly indifferent, but others seem to resent the intrusion of the invitation, and even respond with violence and hostility. Little do they know that by rejecting the invitation, they are also rejecting the King.

But the King does not give up. Why? Because, as Isaiah tells us, God generously wants all to share in his eternal banquet.

But is that the same as saying that all will be there at the great event? No. Like some in the parable, there will be some in this life who will refuse the Lord's invitation. Consumed by this world and its busyness, and concerned with earthly treasures, they lose sight of what is eternal.

How have we responded to that invitation? By gathering on this day, we recommit to our acceptance of it. Around the table of the Lord we find our deepest and truest identity, and the grace we receive encourages and strengthens us in our lifelong preparation for our attendance at the heavenly wedding feast. When we are able to gather at Mass and share in the gift of the Eucharist, we get a foretaste of that great and glorious banquet.

May the gift of the Eucharist in our lives strengthen our faith in the promise that awaits us!

+There is a lot of conversation going on regarding the changes in Executive Orders and laws and whatever. **Please know this:** in coming to church/mass, the Parish Office and anywhere on the St. Andrew/HFRS property, **YOU MUST WEAR A MASK**, and we are still asking that you **SOCIALLY DISTANCE**. There seems to be confusion with to who and where the laws/orders/directives are coming from, but we are following the directives of the Archdiocese. We need to take steps to try to minimize exposure to this terrible virus, and by taking these steps, it is our way of helping out – if not for yourselves, then think of it as an act of kindness for your “neighbors” whom you encounter here on the campus grounds. And please, please – if you have any suspicion that you were exposed to the Covid19 virus say, by a family member or close friend, **DO NOT COME TO CHURCH UNTIL YOU KNOW THAT YOU ARE COVID-FREE.**

+The “**focus**” brochure that I referenced last weekend in my homily was quickly grabbed up after the 5 p.m. Saturday Mass. It is on our parish website, and more “hard copies” are expected to arrive shortly, if they haven’t yet done so as I write this article on Monday.

+Just a quick update on our 2020 CSA efforts. As of this past Monday, we had \$376,590 in donations and pledges made against our target of \$302,657, giving us a potential refund of almost \$74K to be applied to our building loan! I prayerfully thank those who have given. What I ask is for the rest of our parish family to please pray over your participation and sacrificially pledge to our appeal. The more we can pay down the loan balance, the less interest expense we as the parish will have to pay. (Nothing like saving some money, right?!!)

+Last weekend, I was able to handle the pet blessing (thanks to those who came out!), presided at a funeral at noon; and then also presided at the 5 p.m. Saturday evening mass. Then I led the RCIA session on Sunday morning at 10 a.m. Maybe it’s beginning to be a bit like the cartoon “Where’s Waldo?”- You’re going to have to be on the lookout to see where you might find *me* next! And thanks so very much for your prayerful support! God bless you all! I look forward to seeing you!

The Blessing of Pets & Animals

Several people brought their pets to the church to be blessed last Saturday on the eve of St. Francis' feast day because of his love for animals as expressed in his Cantic of Creatures. If you missed it, there are photos below, but you can pray for and bless your pets and animals at home too. A verbal blessing can be offered.

The following Pet Blessing can be used:

Blessed are you, Lord God, maker of all living creatures.

You called forth fish in the sea, birds in the air, and animals on the land.

You inspired St. Francis to call all of them his brothers and sisters.

We ask you to bless this pet.

By the power of your love, enable it to live according to your plan.

May we always praise you for all your beauty in creation.

Blessed are you, Lord our God, in all your creatures! Amen.

Go Deeper

Consider donating pet food or gently used blankets and towels to the local animal shelter around this time of the year. The Feast of St. Francis of Assisi provides an opportunity to teach children about endangered or abused animals and what we can do to help.

Adult Confirmation

Adults who are baptized Catholic, have received First Communion but have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation, are eligible to sign up for our Adult Confirmation program. Two times a year, Confirmation preparation sessions will be offered to prepare adults for the celebration of Confirmation.

Confirmation may be received at different times throughout the year; first at our St. Andrew Parish celebration, or at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament on the Feast of Christ the King Sunday, or on Pentecost Sunday. The Archdiocese of Detroit encourages people to participate in their parish Confirmation celebrations. When this is not possible then people are invited to participate in the Cathedral's Confirmation ceremonies.

Adult Confirmation is a very simple process:

1. You need to have been Baptized and received Communion in the Catholic Church.
If not, you need to register for the RCIA process.
2. You need to attend the Confirmation preparation sessions. Candidates for Confirmation are asked to complete all preparation sessions before the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation.
3. You are asked to bring to the first session a recent copy of your Baptismal Certificate with notations.
Please contact the church of your baptism and request a "new" Baptismal Certificate with notations (issued within six months).
4. You need to choose a Confirmation sponsor. A Confirmation sponsor must be over sixteen years of age; be a practicing Catholic who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist; and not be the father or mother of the one to be confirmed (cf. CCC 874). Canon Law further states: *"It is desirable that the one who undertook the role of sponsor at Baptism be the sponsor for Confirmation"* (CCC 893).

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Scripture readings center on stewardship. The prophet Isaiah informs us that God will *provide for all peoples* who trust in Him. In the parable of the wedding feast in St. Matthew's Gospel, Jesus presents God's invitation to all to join Him in holiness. Sadly, because Christ invites but never forces, many reject His call. St. Paul, in his Letter to the Philippian community, is grateful for the generous financial support they bestow, not out of Paul's needs, but from their own desire to give. God calls us, as faith-filled stewards, to give back to Him the "first fruits" of our efforts in appreciation for His abundant blessings. Sacrificial gifts please God because we abstain in order to give. When challenged with difficult financial situations, make a leap of faith in your giving and know that God's generosity is never outdone. A reference to tithing — the Biblical practice of returning 10 percent to the Lord — is mentioned in the Old Testament. To achieve this tithe, begin slowly and increase in small increments — as little as 1 percent — each year.
