# On the Advent Journey

+John the Baptist is the last prophet before the coming of the Christ, and he is the first to recognize Jesus once He came. John fulfills Isaiah's prophecy as that voice crying out in the desert — prepare the way of the Lord. His clothing of camel's hair was traditional garb for prophets, and his diet of locusts and wild honey perhaps reflected either Jewish purity laws or a particular communal asceticism. As it was, it stood in stark contrast to the finery of the Jewish religious leaders and elders of that time, namely the Sadducees and Pharisees.

Yet John was drawing large crowds to the Jordan riverbank. Some likely came out of desire, believing he would lead them to the Messiah. Others perhaps came out of curiosity. John spoke like no one else, and called them to conversion, speaking with conviction. With such a following, it would have been easy for John to proclaim himself the Christ, and even easier for the people to believe him. Yet his humility and holiness meant that John could not lie or mislead them. He made it clear that his message and baptism were both inferior to the one, as he said, who is mightier than I.

John's preparation of the way for Christ is a model for us, especially in Advent. He challenges us to consider whether we lead others to Jesus, or whether our actions are motivated by a need for attention and affirmation. Is our lived faith attractive to those who have none? This last question is especially important, for while we prepare to celebrate Christ's birth, we also prepare for his Second Coming. And, as Saint Peter says in our second reading, the day of the Lord will come like a thief.

Peter helps us regain the sense of urgency regarding our preparations for the return of our king, when he says, the Lord does not delay....He is patient with you...not wishing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance. Jesus is giving the whole world time for conversion; that we might play a part in sharing the Good News of Christ with the world, for the salvation of the world is a great and weighty gift. And <u>now</u> is the time, especially in light of all the challenges that have come our way.

As we await the new heavens and a new earth, Saint Peter tells us we get to choose what sort of persons [we] ought to be. We are given these days to grow in holiness and devotion so that we will be eager to be found without spot or blemish before Him, at peace, when He comes.

During this time of year, a time when we are doing so much to prepare for the coming of Christmas, let us make sure to heed the voice crying out in the wilderness — to prepare for the coming of the Christ, not just as a babe in Bethlehem, but his return in glory as our King. May we grow in devotion so as to prepare the way of the Lord in our homes and in our hearts!



you maybe forgot to turn in your gift card/donation, you may still do so at the Parish Office or in the collection (mark it for "Giving Tree"), as during these cold winter months, we often get many, many more requests for help, so your gift will be put to good use.

+We will be celebrating the feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8 with masses both in the morning at 9 a.m. as well as in the evening at 7 p.m. While the obligation to attend mass has been lifted by the Archbishop until Feb. 17, 2021, (Ash Wednesday), it would be nice to honor Our Lady on this, the patronal feast day of the United States. Let us remember to ask Mary to watch over us, guide us and keep us safe while we struggle still in dealing with the pandemic.

+As we all prepare for the gift-giving of Christmas, please do not forget to support our parish at this time, and that also includes giving to our parish 2020 CSA, if you have not yet done so. We have been managing alright through these months with your generosity, but are still working to boost our income for all the "surprises" that have come our way already through the year (for example, drain problem in the Parish Center, \$32,000, unbudgeted; heating and cooling units in the A/B and school, \$8,000 unbudgeted). Your support will be prayerfully helpful!

The CSA has approached a potential refund level of \$153,000, should everyone honor their pledges. Your sacrificial giving will be blessed by our Lord!

- +This week we are expected to hear the announcement of how the "Family of Parishes" will be shaped, and with which parishes we will be "linked" to in our area. Please pray for this effort, which springs forth from Synod 16 back a few years ago and the pastoral letter by the Archbishop, *Unleash the Gospel*, which was a result of that gathering. This effort will be part of our main focus as we move into the future, moving from a concept of "maintenance" to "mission" in our parish life and ministries. Stay tuned for more information as it becomes available; you can log on to the AoD website to read more about this movement amongst the parishes in the Archdiocese. .
- +With our attempt to have a "communal" penance service this next Saturday, please know that we will work to "keep things moving" as they say, and ask for your help in doing the same. What I am trying to convey is that it is not a time of long conversations and "spiritual direction" when with the priest. These past Saturdays have been a little busy, and not being disrespectful to anyone, we do not want the celebration of the sacrament to turn into long conversation with any one person. If you need to spend more time with one of the priests, please call the office and we will work with you to set up an appointment there (at which time we can also celebrate the sacrament!). Thanks for your cooperation!
- +Please be mindful of the requirement to wear masks whenever you are in church or anywhere on the campus of St. Andrew and Holy Family Regional School. Plenty of hand washing, and lots of hand sanitizer for everyone!
- +May we not get too caught up in all the materiality of the season, but work to recognize the presence of Christ in our midst. Let us bring his presence to all those we meet! God bless you all!


## 2nd Sunday of Advent

In our First Reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, he announces, *A voice cries out: In the desert prepare the way of the Lord! In* St. Mark's Gospel, the evangelist echoes these words through St. John the Baptist. Jesus' cousin announces, *a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins* in preparation of *One mightier than I is coming after me*. The Baptist goes on to state, *I have baptized you with water; He will baptize you with Holy Spirit.* What a tremendous gift! St. Peter further instructs us to prepare ourselves to meet the Lord. During this Advent season, are we being faith-filled stewards by asking the Holy Spirit to prepare our hearts, minds, and souls — to seek a closer union with God as we ready ourselves for Christmas? # **Immaculate Conception**

The Feast, which is celebrated on December 8th, was pronounced and defined by Pope Pius IX in 1854. Still there is often confusion about what this feast celebrates. First, let's define what it's not. It is not the conception of Jesus by Mary through the Holy Spirit, that is the Feast of the Annunciation. Rather, the Immaculate Conception refers to Mary, who was conceived in the natural way by her parents Joachim and Anne, but, was preserved from original sin and its stain by God's sanctifying grace. This understanding was held for many centuries, before becoming an official Dogma of the Church. While this Feast is usually a Holy Day of Obligation, this year with the extension of the dispensation to attend Mass by the Archbishop in light of the continuing pandemic, the obligation is removed.



# **Our Lady of Guadalupe**

Feast Day, December 12

Our Lady of Guadalupe, also called the Virgin of Guadalupe, is the Virgin Mary in her appearance before Juan Diego in a vision in 1531. The name also refers to the Marian apparition itself. Our Lady of Guadalupe holds a special place in the religious life of Mexico and is one of the most popular religious devotions.

According to tradition, Mary appeared to Juan Diego, who was an Aztec convert to Christianity, on December 9 and again on December 12, 1531. She requested that a shrine to her be built on the spot where she appeared, Tepeyac Hill (now in a suburb of Mexico City). The bishop, however demanded a sign before he would approve construction of a church. Mary appeared a second time to Juan Diego and ordered him to collect roses. In a second audience with the bishop, Juan Diego opened his cloak, letting dozens of roses fall to the floor and revealing the image of Mary imprinted on the inside of the cloak—the image that is now venerated in the Basilica of Guadalupe.

Pope John Paul II canonized Juan Diego and declared Our Lady of Guadalupe the patroness of the Americas.

# **RCIA...Rite of Acceptance and Rite of Welcome**

On Sunday, December 6th, those involved in the RCIA process will be formally introduced to the community through the "Rite of Acceptance" and the "Rite of Welcome". This is a time in the RCIA process when we as a faith community accept, welcome, affirm and bless those who will be celebrating the fullness of their Initiation into the Catholic faith at the Easter Vigil.

**Accept** - Those who are seeking Baptism, as well as those Baptized in another faith, come before us and ask that they may join in the faith journey of the Catholic faith.

**Welcome** - With their sponsors, we welcome them and promise to support them through prayer and witness.

**Affirm** - As the Candidates and Catechumens declare their intention to join us in love, service and prayer, we affirm them and present them with a copy of our Sacred Scriptures.

**Bless**—They are blessed with the sign of the cross, and hear the words: "Receive the cross. It is Christ himself who now strengthens you with this sign of love." This blessing is carried out by the sponsors, and includes all of the senses: ears, lips, eyes, hands and feet.

As a Church that proclaims who we are through our liturgical experiences, the time of Advent will speak loud and clear, that we accept, welcome, affirm, and bless: Leasa, Tad, Jennifer, Linda, Rich, Darlene, Dominica, Matt and Joe as we journey in faith to Bethlehem, Jerusalem, and the Kingdom of God together. You are asked to please remember them in your prayers.


