On the Journey

+ To hear Job's expressions of despair is not a very uplifting way to start this weekend's Liturgy of the Word. Life has become unbearable to Job. He describes life as drudgery and misery, without hope or happiness. He has lost his children, his wealth, and is stricken with boils from head to toe. Have we ever felt that we just can't handle one more hardship in our life? Many have felt this way over the past 10 months with all the impacts that stem from the coronavirus that has sent the world into pandemic. Our circumstances may vary, but the feelings are the same. Job gives expression to a universal human experience of grief and despair.

The despair of the first reading is contrasted with the hope of the Gospel. Simon's mother-in-law is lying sick at home, unable to get up. Jesus grasps her hand, helps her up, and her fever leaves her. Outside her door, there is a whole town's worth of people with various diseases, or who are possessed by demons, whom Jesus also cures. Jesus brings hope to this despairing community. Then He goes on to preach and cure in other villages. As He proclaimed: *For this purpose have I come.*

This is our hope: the hope of God's people for the coming of the Kingdom. It is hope for the fulfillment of God's promise to heal the broken-hearted and bind up their wounds. In Jesus we experience this fulfillment. Like Simon's mother-in-law, we are able to get up and live again. She was able to get up and serve Jesus. So, too, others touched and cured by Jesus are able to get up and live again.

Living in hope saves us from the misery, if not necessarily the tragedies, experienced by Job. Living in hope – having met Christ and received the Good News of the kingdom of God – allows us to live for the sake of the Gospel as we await Christ's return, as Paul did.

Like Job, we know despair; like St. Paul, we know hope. Knowing both is a part of the human condition. Our call is to live by hope, to be people of hope, and to – like Paul – share our hope freely with others. In doing so, we will be healed, and help bring about Christ's healing grace to those whom we meet on the journey!

+Thank you to our Religious Formation staff and all our parents who helped prepare their young daughters and sons for the celebration of the sacrament of Reconciliation over these past two weeks. It was handled reverently and in line with COVID-19 guidelines. May this sacrament bring healing and offer hope to all who partake of God's boundless love and mercy!

+In talking after mass last weekend – and reminding people to bring in their palms for burning for ashes to be used on Ash Wednesday – I was gently reminded that last year, we did not get to "celebrate" Palm Sunday as usual since churches were shut down (this at the start of the pandemic). So many of you might not have palms to

bring. But if you do, please bring the old ones in for burning. We are working on a “safe” way to distribute palms as you enter the church on Palm Sunday this year.

There will be a wide variety of activities going on to accompany you on your Lenten journey. Ash Wednesday will have morning and evening masses along with a Scripture service in the afternoon. All will include the distribution of ashes. Additional reconciliation times are planned, along with one communal celebration of Reconciliation to be held on March 16th at St. Irenaeus (this – like our Advent communal celebration – will be held for our “Family of Parishes”, hence the involvement of St. Irenaeus, St. Mary of the Hills along with St. Andrew.) In place of a “Parish Mission,” there will be 3 special evening events along the Lenten journey for presentations, reflections and prayer, here at St. Andrew, all COVID-compliant. You will find details elsewhere in the bulletin, so just cut it out and keep it handy for the next couple months! (We continue our wait to hear by February 9th the decision about the next stage of mass obligation and celebration of the season from the Archdiocesan Offices.)

These events are in addition to the many other Adult Faith Formation offerings in which the parish is already immersed. My friends, there are many opportunities for you to grow in faith and not come down with a case of “cabin fever” during this month of February and the season of Lent!

+Our parish celebration of World Marriage Day will be held on February 27th at the 5 p.m. mass. Please contact the office or mail in the clip-out form from the bulletin. Sadly, we will not be able to have a reception afterward as we normally do, but we still wish to honor all those celebrating special “benchmark” anniversaries. Let the rest of us support YOU in prayer on this special day!

+Let us continue to pray for one another, especially in light of the pandemic. May the Holy Spirit keep us all safe and healthy.

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today’s Scripture readings concentrate on the topics of suffering and healing, faith, preaching the Good News of the Gospel, and prayer. In the passage from the Book of Job, he suffers immensely, yet in what is revealed later in the Book, stays focused on his belief in God. St. Paul proclaims that he has been charged with preaching the Gospel, saying, *woe to me if I do not preach it.* The evangelist, St. Mark in his Gospel, reiterates that Jesus, at His disciples’ prompting, heals Simon-Peter’s mother-in-law. This miracle stresses the importance of prayer knowing that, through faith, God will always give us strength in times of distress and if it is His will, heal us from our infirmities. Daily communication with God is necessary to grow in discipleship. Take a few minutes each day in quiet time to talk with our Lord

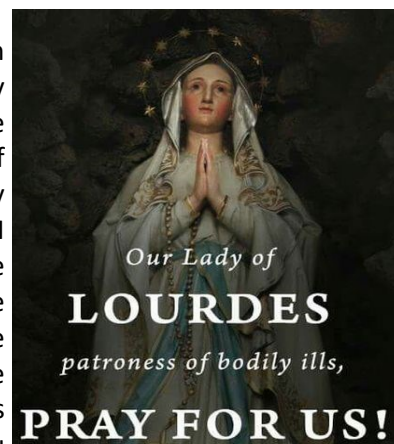

World Day of the Sick

The Catholic Church marks the annual day on 11 February, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. Instituted by Pope Saint John Paul II on 13 May 1992, the first World Day of the Sick was marked the following year. The theme of this year's observance is, "You have but one teacher and you are all brothers" (Mt 23:8), which calls for "a trust-based relationship to guide care for the sick".

Pope Francis says that the annual day "is an opportunity to devote special attention to the sick and to those who provide them with assistance and care both in healthcare institutions and within families and communities." He expresses his spiritual closeness and the Church's loving concern for those suffering the coronavirus pandemic, especially the poor and the marginalized.

"A society is all the more human to the degree that it cares effectively for its most frail and suffering members, in a spirit of fraternal love. Let us strive to achieve this goal so that no one will feel alone, excluded, or abandoned." Pope Francis

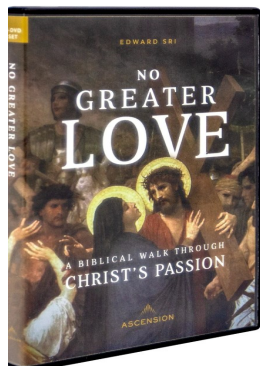

Hearts can be fragile...physically and emotionally.

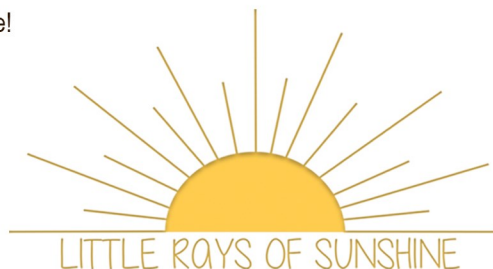

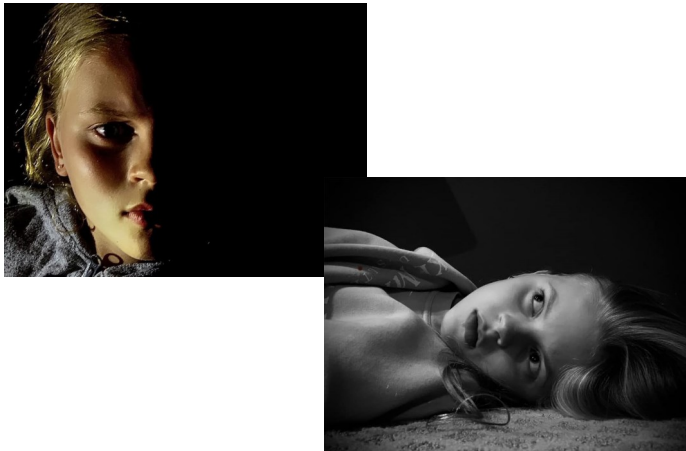
