Parish Mission Statement

On the Lenten Journey

+Each of us longs to know and love God better. Each of us needs the grace of God in our lives. Today's readings subtly teach us something important about receiving grace and instruction from God. First, He must cleanse us. First, He must make room in our hearts so that He can fill us with his grace.

We notice in the first reading that, before God gave the Israelites the Ten Commandments, writing his law on their hearts, He had to get them out of Egypt. He had to free them so that they could be free to love and serve Him. In the Gospel, Jesus cleanses the temple, making *a whip out of cords* and overturning tables! But then, He teaches. He prophesies his glorious resurrection.

Lent is a time for examining what obstacles to grace and instruction from God may be in our lives. Remember that God respects our free will, and so He doesn't "force" his grace upon us; we have to cooperate. So we, in humility, ask ourselves: What do we need to "cleanse" in order to "make room" for God's abundant grace? What false idols might we rank higher than God, even unconsciously? We know that the temple of [Jesus'] body was destroyed and raised. Therefore, we can trust that the same God who raised Jesus from the dead can also cleanse and breathe new life into our hearts. To the world, it may seem foolish to place God and his commandments first in our lives, above money, power, and pleasure. But Saint Paul reminds us that to unbelievers, the simple fact that we glorify Christ crucified — Jesus killed as a criminal — is foolish, at best. God in his infinite wisdom, desired this to be the way humankind was saved, and so we proclaim with joy: Christ has died: Christ is risen; and Christ will come again.

So as we journey through Lent, let us work at opening our hearts to the "cleansing" power of God, making room for the Lord to take his rest with us - to comfort, guard and guide us on our journey.

+Just a reminder that next weekend – when the general obligation to attend mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is re-instated, we will be re-instating the 10 a.m. Sunday morning Mass. We still ask that you try to register ahead of time (for contact tracing purposes, should it be necessary). Masks and social distancing are still required. The Saturday evening 5 p.m. Mass will still be lived streamed and "loaded out" on the website for those who cannot make it to mass for the weekend. The 12 noon mass on Sundays will no longer be live-streamed. The chapel will be opened for over-flow seating just at the 10 a.m. and 12 noon masses on Sundays to begin with on an 'as-needed' basis, and then we will see how that goes.

What we <u>could use</u> to <u>help</u> in bringing back this time for Sunday liturgy is additional ministers to help out: Ushers, Greeters, Lectors, Eucharistic ministers. PLEASE contact Nikki and let her know if you are able to assist in any way along these lines.



+Just a little reminder that those preparing for Confirmation....preparation meetings are scheduled for this Sunday, March 7, Thursday, March 11, and next Saturday, March 13. Students must attend ONE of those meetings. Please don't forget to sign-up in advance and attend!

+As we start to come together with the Family of Parishes throughout the Archdiocese, we will be making sure that more information is placed in the bulletin regarding "joint activities/opportunities." Please <u>do not</u> think this is any kind of "merger/clustering" with the intent to close a particular site (I've heard that rumor a couple of times.) It is to establish a stronger "network" of activities and strengthen the bonds of collegiality by working together. Think of it maybe more like a "minivicariate". It is meant to broaden the scope of activities and help support each other in faith formation efforts at all ages. The plan is also to examine how we can do more ministry together when, as forecast in ten years or so, there will be an anticipated 100 fewer priests in our Archdiocese. Remember our family is made up of St. Mary of the Hills, St. Irenaeus, and our very own St. Andrew parish.

While each parish here will retain its "pastor', we each will be working together for the betterment of all three locations. Similarly, any associate pastors will be assigned to a family to assist in the multiple settings, though his direct assignment is to one pastor at a particular parish location. And to help in this overall effort, one of the three pastors will be appointed as a "moderator," a pastor overseeing the work of all 3 sites. For our family, I have been invited by the Archbishop to be the first moderator of our Pontiac Area Vicariate Wave 1 Family.

For now, we are only at the very beginnings of this part of our parish faith journey together. I would imagine that it will take a couple years for this to be completely "unfolded" in our parishes and families, so I ask that you pray for me as the new moderator, and pray for our entire "family."

+May our Lenten journey continue to help us all grow in faith! I look forward to seeing more of you in church! Know of my special prayers for all of you and your families!

The RCIA Scrutinies A Call for Self-Searching and Repentance

The RCIA Scrutinies are special rituals for those preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism/Confirmation/Eucharist) at the Easter Vigil. The Rite of Christian Initiation states: "The Scrutinies are meant to uncover, and then heal all that is weak, defective or sinful in the hearts of the Elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good."

Over the next three weeks, those preparing for Baptism will stand before us as we invoke the blessing and power of the Holy Spirit upon them. You will see them, and those Candidates preparing for the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist, at various liturgies each week during Lent.

Please keep in your prayers: Leasa, Tad, Richard, Linda, Jennifer, Preston, Dominica, Alexandra, Matthew, and Joseph.

This Lenten time is truly a deepening of God's loving Grace.

10:00AM Mass Returns March 14

With the lifting of the dispensation from attending Mass outside of the exceptions listed by the Archbishop, we will be reinstating the 10:00AM Mass on March 14. We are still asking people to preregister for Mass, we will still have capacity limits to provide for physical distancing and everyone will still be required to wear a mask covering their nose and mouth. The return of the 10:00AM Mass has been long awaited by many of you and we will need help in a few areas as we return. If you are a greeter or an usher, we need you. If you are not yet either, but would like to be, please call the parish office and we will be happy to get you signed up as a volunteer. Should you have any questions about the return to Mass, please call the parish office.



We are in need of Ushers for Mass. In particular there is great need for the 10:00AM and 12:00PM Sunday Mass and 5:00PM Saturday and Sunday Mass. On the "job" training is provided for this ministry. If you are interested in serving, please contact the parish office.

A note about the reception of Communion

Recently the Eucharistic Ministers have noticed an increase in the number of people trying to take the host from them or closing their hand before the host has been completely placed into it. Especially now, as we try to stay as safe as possible, we remind you of the proper way to receive Communion. Upon approaching the minister of the Host extend the hands in the middle of the chest. The left hand is extended, with the right hand under the left in support (left handed persons may wish to place the left hand under the right). In essence, a throne is formed in the sign of an X-cross to receive the Sacred Host. The response of "Amen" is given to the proclamation "The Body of Christ," and the Host is received. The host is never taken from the minister. For those who choose to receive on the tongue, at this time you are asked to wait to be at the end of the line. When you approach the minister after saying "Amen" in response to the minister of Holy Communion, the communicant should open the mouth wide and extend the tongue far enough so that the Sacred Host can be placed upon it without danger of falling.

3 Pillar Thoughts

In keeping with the Lenten practices, here are some possible ideas to consider:

Prayer: Consider using one of the online resources for daily prayer provided by Loyola Press at www.ignatianspirituality.com/lent/

Fasting: Fast from negative self-talk, see yourself as wonderfully created by God. Fast from Judging others and remember that they too are children of God.

Almsgiving: Reach out to those around you with your time or your talents. See if there are ways to be of service even in the midst of the pandemic.

Low Gluten Hosts

St. Andrew Parish has low gluten hosts available for those with gluten intolerance or celiac disease. These are still available despite the pandemic, so please, if you have need of these hosts, let a mass coordinator know before mass begins and we will be happy to make arrangements for you to receive a low gluten host.

St Andrew Needlework Group

During this season of Lent, when we are concentrating on prayer, fasting and almsgiving, consider making your "alms" something you knit or crochet for charity. This could be the year you make your almsgiving personal and prayerful.

The St Andrew Church Needlework Group has continued to function throughout 2020 and into 2021. A small group of people who knit and crochet have produced an amazing quantity of hats, scarves, and mittens for adults and children at The Haven and Pontiac charity centers, prayer shawls for those dealing with long term illness, and baby things for newborns at Beaumont Hospital's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. Early in 2020, the group didn't meet but worked at home; as weather warmed, we met in backyards on Saturday morning. This winter, we have met periodically, masked and distanced, to gather up completed projects, distribute yarn for new projects, and encourage each other in this much needed work for charity.

We invite you to join us. Your "alms" this year could keep someone warm and increase your own prayer life. If you need ideas, yarn, patterns, a little help to get started, we are ready to welcome you.

A Lenten Thought—Drew Peters, Christian Service

During Lent we are encouraged to meet Christ in our journeys and certainly there is much more complicating our lives at this turn. Political and socio-economic unrest, uncertainty, the rise of anxiety clouded by the pandemic are all felt personally and collectively.

In this week's Gospel, Jesus encounters the Samaritan women at the well. She is caught off guard in surprise that he, a Jew, would be speaking to her. Jesus breaks through all her fear to give her hope in "living water."

This Lent who are you encountering?

Pope Francis, in the recent encyclical Fratelli Tutti reflecting on another Samaritan encounter on the road to Jericho speaks to this:

"Let us seek out others and embrace the world as it is, without fear of pain or a sense of inadequacy, because there we will discover all the goodness that God has planted in human hearts. Difficulties that seem overwhelming are opportunities for growth, not excuses for glum resignation leading to acquiescence.

Jesus asks us not to decide who is close enough to be our neighbor, but rather that we ourselves become neighbors to all. Jesus asks us to be present to those in need, regardless of whether or not they are in our social group."

Indeed turning our hearts to Love of God and Love of neighbor brings hope to this world. As St Paul says we have this grace, "Hope does not disappoint because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts."

Archdiocese of Detroit

The general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (including the anticipatory Mass at 4:00pm or later on the previous day) is to be reinstated in the Archdiocese of Detroit effective Saturday, March 13, 2021.



Considering the grave obligation we have of being physically present with our brothers and sisters at Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation for the Eucharist, each of us is asked to make a good and sincere judgement as to whether these circumstances apply or not. Where doubt or confusion persists, consult any priest for clarity.

While the general dispensation is removed, there are specific instances where the dispensation will continue, as well as those circumstances where there is no obligation in the first place. One does not have an obligation to attend Mass on Sunday in the following circumstances:

- 1. You are ill or your health condition would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness (i.e., you have underlying conditions or are in a high-risk category). *Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass*.
- 2. You exhibit flu-like symptoms. Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass.
- 3. You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (e.g., you were in recent contact with someone who tested positive for a contagious illness such as COVID or influenza). *Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass*.
- 4. You care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed.
- 5. You are pregnant.
- 6. Those 65 years of age or older (per the CDC's recommendation of high-risk individuals).
- 7. You cannot attend Mass through no fault of your own (e.g., no Mass is offered, you are infirmed, or, while wanting to go, you are prevented for some reason you cannot control (e.g., your ride did not show up, the church was at capacity)).
- 8. If you have *significant* fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass.

For questions about the application of any of these, please contact your pastor / parish priest.

These categories will be reviewed in due course and revised as needed.

Those within categories #1-8 above must still observe the Lord's Day and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sunday, meditating on the Lord's passion, death and resurrection; an excellent way to do this is through participating in a broadcast of the Sunday Mass.



Fasting: What's Standing in Your Way?

Fasting, abstaining from food and drink, has long been a path to becoming closer to God. It brings heightened awareness and clarity. Many find true peace and happiness in this way. But fasting doesn't always involve giving up food. It can also be about getting rid of whatever is standing in the way of a better relationship between you and God.

If the media has a hold on you, try fasting from that. What TV shows might you turn off for 40 days? Do you love to shop for nothing in particular? See how long you can go without buying things you don't really need. (It may even redefine how you view your money.) Fast from bad food choices by researching healthier ways to eat. Maybe you need to fast from trash. Reduce your waste by passing up products that have lots of packaging, reusing your own grocery bags and recycling more.

Take a good look at what you can fast from this Lent to grow closer to God. Who knows? You may even cultivate some great new habits for healthier, more spiritual living.


