### On the Easter Journey

†The Gospel doesn't tell us if Thomas ever did put his hand in Jesus' wound, but that doesn't matter. Either way, he and the other Apostles received all Jesus had to give from his pierced heart: the gift of divine mercy that we celebrate today.

Here at the end of the Easter Octave, we're called to reflect on how divine mercy sums up the whole mystery of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. Notice how Jesus immediately greets the Apostles on that first Easter with peace, and shares his bountiful mercy – giving them his own power of forgiveness. It is the deepest truth God has shared about himself: He is mercy, He loves us even when we don't deserve it.

This is tremendously freeing. It frees us from worrying that we're not good enough to earn his love, from distancing ourselves from Him out of shame for our sins – as if we could ever hide them from Him! Above all, it sets us free from the sin of despair, of thinking that we're too far gone for God to save us. How could a human creature's mistakes outweigh the forgiveness of the infinite Creator?

When our Lord appeared to Saint Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, He instructed her to paint what is now the famous image of himself with two rays coming from this heart, red and white for the blood and water that flowed from his side on the cross, with the inscription, "Jesus, I trust in you." The water stands for the washing away of our sins in baptism and reconciliation; the blood for the new life that we receive in the Eucharist. As our second reading tells us, it's Jesus, *the one who came through water and blood*, who has conquered the world.

God's mercy not only cleanses us from our past, it gives us a way forward. When we allow it into our hearts, it manifests in our works of mercy for others. The peace and mercy Jesus gives the Apostles comes with a command to go and share it: *As the Father has sent me, so I send you*. These men who had been hiding in a locked room then became such powerful witnesses to the Resurrection that they established a community unequalled in solidarity and generosity.

This may seem impossible to us because we know how weak we are. We may have as much difficulty as Thomas did in having faith in what Christ has promised us. And to truly love each other as God's children? To be of *one heart and mind* like the community of the Apostles, setting aside our own attachments to serve the needs of others? There are few things more difficult than this kind of sacrificial love. Yet Saint John insists that these commandments *are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God* – that is, whomever has faith – *conquers the world*.

Divine Mercy sets us free from the sins of the past and empowers us to live holy lives in the present. So let us keep fixed in our minds these words: **Jesus, I trust in you!**

### Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska

Saint Faustina's name is forever linked to the annual feast of the Divine Mercy, the Divine Mercy chaplet, and the Divine Mercy prayer recited each day at 3 p.m. by many people.

Born in what is now west-central Poland, Helena Kowalska was the third of 10 children. She worked as a housekeeper in three cities before joining the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in 1925. She worked as a cook, gardener and porter in three of their houses.

In addition to carrying out her work faithfully, generously serving the needs of the sisters and the local people, Sister Faustina also had a deep interior life. This included receiving revelations from the Lord Jesus, messages that she recorded in her diary at the request of Christ and of her confessors.

At a time when some Catholics had an image of God as such a strict judge that they might be tempted to despair about the possibility of being forgiven, Jesus chose to emphasize his mercy and forgiveness for sins acknowledged and confessed. "I do not want to punish aching mankind," he once told Saint Faustina, "but I desire to heal it, pressing it to my merciful heart." The two rays emanating from Christ's heart, she said, represent the blood and water poured out after Jesus' death.

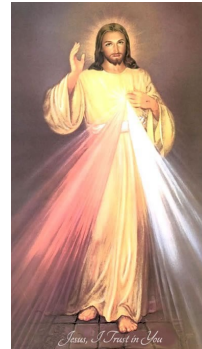
Because Sister Maria Faustina knew that the revelations she had already received did not constitute holiness itself, she wrote in her diary: "Neither graces, nor revelations, nor raptures, nor gifts granted to a soul make it perfect, but rather the intimate union of the soul with God. These gifts are merely ornaments of the soul, but constitute neither its essence nor its perfection. My sanctity and perfection consist in the close union of my will with the will of God."

Sister Maria Faustina died of tuberculosis in Krakow, Poland, on October 5, 1938. Pope John Paul II beatified her in 1993, and canonized her seven years later.

### Divine Mercy

The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us – all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

On May 5, 2000, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

## SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION FINAL CELEBRATION!

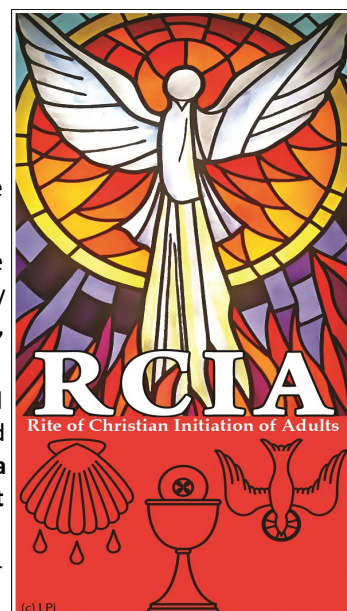

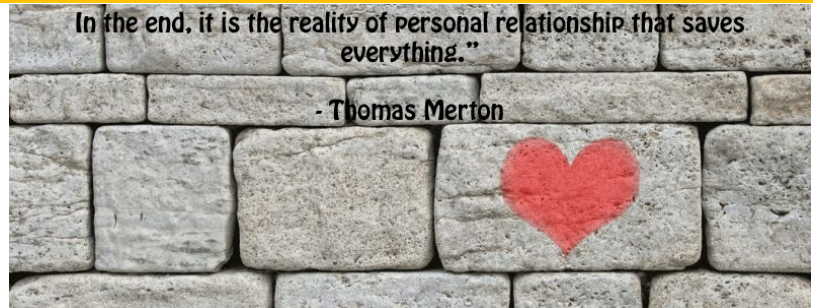

In the Gospel of John we find the disciples amidst a lot of fear. Jesus's response to all of this is to give peace, to give the Holy Spirit, and to call the disciples out of fear to find reconciliation and forgiveness. We are in the midst of much fear and trepidation. We want to avoid people, the media, people who are different from us or think differently or God for bid vote differently. We have failed to see the inherent dignity in others. It is Divine Mercy Sunday and the Second Sunday of Easter. What makes Mercy of Christ so Divine? Perhaps we take a note from Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan. To the scholar's smart question Jesus gives a story that exemplifies what it is to truly love God and love one's neighbor. So the answer to Jesus' question, who was neighbor to the robber's victim? ... the one who showed mercy. And then Jesus says, Go and do likewise. So here is Divine Mercy, it is not only a belief or conviction we hold on to for ourselves, it is a verb, we are called to be people of Mercy. We are called like the Samaritan to be 'moved with compassion.' We are called out of our fear and into relationship with those whom we disagree, are afraid, have written off or with those society has abandoned. By going into our fear of the other, we find the Risen Christ.

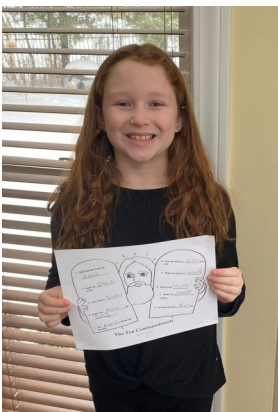
## Love and Mercy

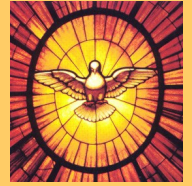

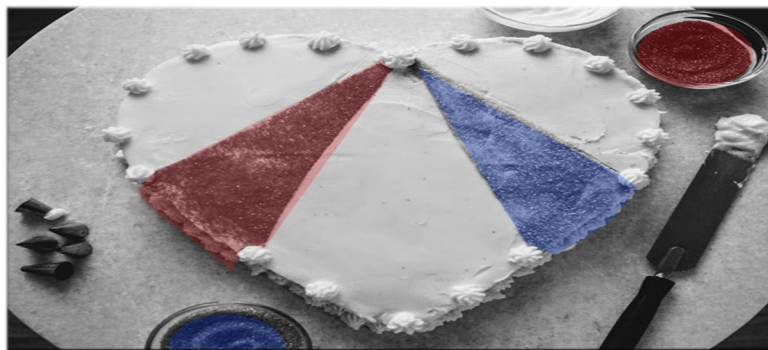

## JESUS, I TRUST IN YOU



A Polish nun by the name of Maria Faustina (now St. Faustina) received a profound revelation of the Divine Mercy given to us by our crucified savior, Jesus. We are bestowed a mercy we do not deserve and could never merit ourselves. This mercy was made visible in the blood and the water that flowed from Jesus's side on the cross. This cake is a wonderful, easy way to share beautifully the lesson of Divine Mercy and to discuss Saint Faustina with your family!

### Ingredients

1 cup butter, softened	3 teaspoons baking powder
2 cups sugar	1 cup milk
4 egg yolks	4 egg whites, stiffly beaten
1 teaspoon vanilla extract	your favorite buttercream frosting recipe
3 cups sifted flour	red sprinkles (or red raspberries)
¼ teaspoon salt	blue sprinkles (or blueberries)

### Directions

Preheat oven to 350°. Cream butter and sugar thoroughly. Add egg yolks and vanilla, beating well. Sift together dry ingredients and add alternately with milk. Stir gently until blended. Fold in beaten egg whites. Pour batter into one square pan and one round pan (this will create the heart shaped cake). Bake for approximately 30 minutes.

When cool, frost with buttercream frosting and decorate with rays streaming from each side (red sprinkles for the red blood of Jesus that is our life, and blue sprinkles for the water that justifies our souls).

The visual image of the cake is a symbol of charity, forgiveness, and the unending love of God, referred to as the "Fountain of Mercy."

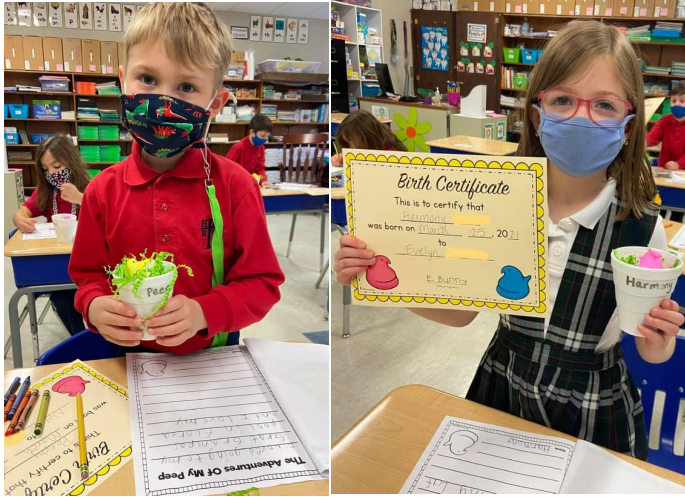
