On the Easter Journey

+The Gospel doesn't tell us if Thomas ever did put his hand in Jesus' wound, but that doesn't matter. Either way, he and the other Apostles received all Jesus had to give from his pierced heart: the gift of divine mercy that we celebrate today.

Here at the end of the Easter Octave, we're called to reflect on how divine mercy sums up the whole mystery of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. Notice how Jesus immediately greets the Apostles on that first Easter with peace, and shares his bountiful mercy – giving them his own power of forgiveness. It is the deepest truth God has shared about himself: He is mercy, He loves us even when we don't deserve it.

This is tremendously freeing. It frees us from worrying that we're not good enough to earn his love, from distancing ourselves from Him out of shame for our sins — as if we could ever hide them from Him! Above all, it sets us free from the sin of despair, of thinking that we're too far gone for God to save us. How could a human creature's mistakes outweigh the forgiveness of the infinite Creator?


When our Lord appeared to Saint Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, He instructed her to paint what is now the famous image of himself with two rays coming from this heart, red and white for the blood and water that flowed from his side on the cross, with the inscription, "Jesus, I trust in you." The water stands for the washing away of our sins in baptism and reconciliation; the blood for the new life that we receive in the Eucharist. As our second reading tells us, it's Jesus, the one who came though water and blood, who has conquered the world.

God's mercy not only cleanses us from our past, it gives us a way forward. When we allow it into our hearts, it manifests in our works of mercy for others. The peace and mercy Jesus gives the Apostles comes with a command to go and share it: *As the Father has sent me, so I send you*. These men who had been hiding in a locked room then became such powerful witnesses to the Resurrection that they established a community unequaled in solidarity and generosity.

This may seem impossible to us because we know how weak we are. We may have as much difficulty as Thomas did in having faith in what Christ has promised us. And to truly love each other as God's children? To be of *one heart and mind* like the community of the Apostles, setting aside our own attachments to serve the needs of others? There are few things more difficult than this kind of sacrificial love. Yet Saint John insists that these commandments *are not burdensome*, *for whoever is begotten by God* – that is, whomever has faith – *conquers the world*.

Divine Mercy sets us free from the sins of the past and empowers us to live holy lives in the present. So let us keep fixed in our minds these words: *Jesus, I trust in you!*

We will be having a prayer service in the church, starting at 2 p.m., led by Fr. Craig. Please know that there is <u>not</u> a mass scheduled during this time, since we will celebrate the usual/normal vicariate mass at 5 p.m. And as a point of information, since some have asked, it is <u>not</u> necessary to celebrate reconciliation ON THIS DAY to receive the indulgences of the feast; only that you recently celebrate that sacrament.

+As we conclude the octave of Easter, I want to thank all those who helped make our Triduum and Easter celebrations a wonderful expression of faith, in spite of the pandemic in which we live: to Nikki Zakzewski for work in the liturgical and environment areas; Stephan Pawl and our cantors for music enrichment; Susan Kowalski for shepherding our participants in RCIA; Chris Kasperek with the lead on our Easter Giving Tree and our video offerings, and the rest of the staff for filling in as needed with the bevy of background activities that go on to "make it all happen." Divine Mercy Sunday

Today's First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles details how the early community of believers was of one heart and mind, portioning all possessions with no claim of ownership over them. Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska

Saint Faustina's name is forever linked to the annual feast of the Divine Mercy, the Divine Mercy chaplet, and the Divine Mercy prayer recited each day at 3 p.m. by many people.

Born in what is now west-central

Poland, Helena Kowalska was the third of 10 children. She worked as a housekeeper in three cities before joining the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in 1925. She worked as a cook, gardener and porter in three of their houses.

In addition to carrying out her work faithfully, generously serving the needs of the sisters and the local people, Sister Faustina also had a deep interior life. This included receiving revelations from the Lord Jesus, messages that she recorded in her diary at the request of Christ and of her confessors.

At a time when some Catholics had an image of God as such a strict judge that they might be tempted to despair about the possibility of being forgiven, Jesus chose to emphasize his mercy and forgiveness for sins acknowledged and confessed. "I do not want to punish aching mankind," he once told Saint Faustina, "but I desire to heal it, pressing it to my merciful heart." The two rays emanating from Christ's heart, she said, represent the blood and water poured out after Jesus' death.

Because Sister Maria Faustina knew that the revelations she had already received did not constitute holiness itself, she wrote in her diary: "Neither graces, nor revelations, nor raptures, nor gifts granted to a soul make it perfect, but rather the intimate union of the soul with God. These gifts are merely ornaments of the soul, but constitute neither its essence nor its perfection. My sanctity and perfection consist in the close union of my will with the will of God."

Sister Maria Faustina died of tuberculosis in Krakow, Poland, on October 5, 1938. Pope John Paul II beatified her in 1993, and canonized her seven years later.


SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION FINAL CELEBRATION!



JESUS, I TRUST IN YOU



A Polish nun by the name of Maria Faustina (now St. Faustina) received a profound revelation of the Divine Mercy given to us by our crucified savior, Jesus. We are bestowed a mercy we do not deserve and could never merit ourselves. This mercy was made visible in the blood and the water that flowed from Jesus's side on the cross. This cake is a wonderful, easy way to share beautifully the lesson of Divine Mercy and to discuss Saint Faustina with your family!

Ingredients

1 cup butter, softened
2 cups sugar
4 egg yolks
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
3 cups sifted flour

1/4 teaspoon salt

3 teaspoons baking powder

1 cup milk

4 egg whites, stiffly beaten your favorite buttercream frosting recipe

red sprinkles (or red raspberries)
blue sprinkles (or blueberries)

Directions

Preheat oven to 350°. Cream butter and sugar thoroughly. Add egg yolks and vanilla, beating well. Sift together dry ingredients and add alternately with milk. Stir gently until blended. Fold in beaten egg whites. Pour batter into one square pan and one round pan (this will create the heart shaped cake). Bake for approximately 30 minutes.

When cool, frost with buttercream frosting and decorate with rays streaming from each side (red sprinkles for the red blood of Jesus that is our life, and blue sprinkles for the water that justifies our souls).

The visual image of the cake is a symbol of charity, forgiveness, and the unending love of God, referred to as the "Fountain of Mercy."




