#### On the Easter Journey

+Fear is one of the most common of all emotions. We all fall into its grasp from time to time. It can be very real and even cause us to freeze up and not act as we should. The disciples certainly experienced this when Christ appeared in their midst as they were listening to the two disciples [recount] what had taken place on the way.

The risen Christ came, offering them reassurance and peace. It is one thing to hear a story about Christ's post-resurrection appearance, it is another to see it with your own eyes. The evangelist does not hold back in describing their fear — even their incredulity. They see Jesus but they immediately think it might be a ghost or a hallucination.

But Jesus will not allow that fear to have the last word. Reassuring them of his real, actual presence, He proves it by the most common of all actions: He invites them to look at this hands and feet, and to touch Him so they will sense the reality of flesh and bones, which a ghost does not have. And then He eats in front of them – something else a ghost would not do. But more than just ameliorating the disciples' fear, Jesus presence has a triple purpose: to prove his resurrection, to help them understand the fulfilled Scriptures, and to prepare them for their mission before the world.

Jesus calls them witnesses – *martyrs* in Greek – disciples who give all to proclaim the risen Christ. Peter becomes one of the great examples of this change. In our first reading, we saw a different Peter from the Good Friday man who denied Jesus three times. Filled with the truth of the Resurrection and the power of the Spirit, he is the very opposite of fearful. Now he has the courage to stand before those who condemned Jesus – to proclaim Him as the fulfillment of the prophetic promises and to call all to repentance. Saint John matches this powerful message with a reminder to his community of the immensity of Jesus' forgiveness.

So what about us? It is easy in our broken humanity to allow fear and doubt to control us. Yet they must never have the last word: Christ always finds a way to reassure us of the truth and reality of the Resurrection and its offer of life. As believers, we find that reassurance in the sacramental and liturgical life of the Church where the Scriptures are proclaimed and the Spirit is at work. Here we encounter Christ, the second person of the Holy Trinity. Here He takes away our fears and doubts and frees us to go out and share the Good News – unleashing the Gospel in both word and deed. Jesus has conquered sin and death. The reign of fear is over! What a great gift, what a great blessing we have received!

+As we journey through the Easter season and through Spring, we know it is the time of the year to celebrate first Holy Communion for many of our little ones. They have been preparing for this most special occasion and many are ready to approach the (continued on page 3)

altar of the Lord and receive Jesus in this most special way! So please keep them in your prayers. The parish will be celebrating with them in four smaller groups for the next two upcoming weekends, Saturday, April 24<sup>th</sup> at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m., and then again on Saturday, May 1<sup>st</sup>, also at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. (There will be no confessions on those particular Saturdays, but you can always call the office and arrange a time should you need to do so.) Other students and their families may be celebrating during the course of the next few months, and we will welcome them to God's table at those times!

+By now, most if not all of you should have received my letter about the upcoming 2021 CSA. Our hope was to get this out to you before the Archdiocese mailing was sent out, explaining the fact that they have decided to handle the campaign for the parishes (especially the many who struggle in doing so.) We've been blessed with great staff and your generosity, so it has not been a real issue for us here at St. Andrew. Our letter was intended to "beat" the AoD letter explaining things, but downtown beat their own deadline and sent their letter before ours.

Anyway....I ask for your continued support of this year's effort. The target is \$347,814, which sounds like a big increase over last year's – but remember that was reduced by 15% due to the pandemic impact on parish activity and collections. So I ask for your great support once again, knowing of not only the assistance to so many Archdiocesan-wide ministries that CSA funds, but that the overage to our target will be directed to paying down our loan balance (which is now just less than \$2M). Your pledge/donation may be sent EITHER to the Archdiocese in the envelope they included in their mailing, or returned directly to OUR PARISH OFFICES in the envelope included in <u>my</u> letter mailing. I thank you for your support, and pray that we have a successful campaign! God bless you for the sacrifice you make and the generosity you offer to our parish family!

+Some have been asking me, so let me explain....Fr. Craig's assignment to us was for just one year, which he will have completed at the end of this June. St. Andrew is certainly looked at as one of the great "training grounds" and experiences for those men more recently ordained and preparing to take over parish leadership roles as administrators and pastors. Hence the change that we are going through with his departure and Fr. Grayson's arrival. (It has not yet been worked out as to how long Fr. Grayson's assignment will be.) Let us keep both of them, and all priests who will be going through the "transfer process" in our prayers. May the good Lord bless them in the sacrifices they make!

+This past Tuesday I had my sixth infusion therapy, which continues to be of much help! I have been approved for two more years of receiving this medicine, so hopefully, I will continue to work back to full health and remission! I thank you all for your continued prayers!

+As we continue our Easter journey, know of my special prayers for all of you. This past week I attended the first "moderators retreat" for two days as we move forward in our plan of forming "Families of Parishes" here in the Archdiocese. I will keep you posted as we – St. Andrew, St. Mary of the Hills, and St. Irenaeus parishes – continue to work together more in this faith experience that will hopefully provide even more opportunities to grow in our relationship with Jesus and build a stronger community here in Rochester/Rochester Hills!

+Let us keep each other in our Easter prayers. Looking forward to seeing more of you – especially at church! But let us remember our continued efforts with keeping safe and healthy during this time of pandemic....wearing masks, washing hands, sanitizing, social distancing. Thanks for your cooperation and support!


