On the Easter Journey

+Remain in me as I remain in you. Some may ask, "What does that even mean?" St. John answers this is today's second reading. Children, he says, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth. In other words, don't just spout pious niceties, do the work of the Gospel. Feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit those in prison. Love one another. For those who keep his commandments remain in him and he in them, and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us.

Uniting ourselves to Jesus brings us into the divine life of the Holy Trinity. In order to abide with Christ, we need to take on his mind and his heart, and act accordingly. This we are empowered to do through the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit works in us, giving us gifts and helping us to bear fruit for the sake of the Kingdom. This sounds easy on the surface. Yet we probably can think of ways just in the last couple of days that we did not act with the mind or heart of Jesus.

If we profess faith in Jesus Christ, He expects us to offer our whole lives to Him. That includes every action of every day, no matter how we may feel. *By this is my Father glorified*, Jesus says, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.

We can drop the "it looks easy" part here. The most important question we can ask at this point is, "Why?" If the world can offer distractions, pleasures, and a reasonably fulfilling life, why remain with Jesus?

Because no other vine that the world can offer is as life-giving as that of Jesus. A life apart from Him will wither, and be thrown out like a branch at the time of judgment. Without Christ, we can do nothing. Every breath we take is simply and only because God has willed it so. God desires our good, and has made us to live with Him forever in heaven. Nothing the world offers can even compete. Why sacrifice the permanent on the altar of the immediate? Yes, the ask can be considerable, but it is far surpassed by what our Lord offers us in return.

The world cannot offer infinite love. Only God does that. The world cannot provide consolation. Only the Holy Spirit does that. God is greater than our hearts and knows everything, and we receive from Him what we need, and what we ask Jesus is the source of life. Remain with Him, and keep his commandments.

+This weekend we had the second Saturday of first Holy Communion celebrations. As the first week, we enjoyed some very meaningful liturgies with these special little ones receiving the Lord in Communion for the first time. Remember them in your special prayers, encouraging them and their families to come weekly and be united with the family of faith here at St. Andrew!

+The year is winding down for our Religious Formation department as we get to this point on the calendar. I want to thank all of them – Maureen Schreffler, director;



It certainly wasn't an easy task, but I was impressed with their efforts and "programming." As you may know, Maureen will be retiring at the end of this June; she will be succeeded by Barbara Pacella, one of our elementary section heads. Barb's spot will be filled by - and we heartily welcome! - Elizabeth (Beth) Sobczak. I am confident that our wonderful programs will continue as we all move forward — and hopefully, "live and in-person!" We offer our gratitude and best wishes to Maureen for all she has done for our parish family over the years she has been with us!!

- +I offer my personal thanks and gratitude for your support of our 2021 CSA! We are already at \$93,395 in pledges/donations against our target of \$347,814. The "official" kick-off is actually the middle of May, but it is wonderful for this response so far. God bless you for your sacrifices!
- +This past week the Archdiocese held meetings regarding "Parish Incorporation." This was a topic looked at some years back, but was put on the "back-burner" for various reasons at that time. Now we are moving forward with this plan, which puts canon (Church) law and civil law more in sync with one another. What it means is that each parish church community will be incorporated separately (as a non-profit), as opposed to all parishes being part of one big "corporation sole," headed by the Archbishop.

The Archdiocese has been handling most of the work, and it sounds like this will not add a significant amount of work for individual parishes. The pastor will become the "president" and there will be a small board set up. But know that the Archbishop will be on the board of each parish, so ultimately, we are still accountable to him. (This incorporation process is not related to the Family of Parish efforts.) More on this to come.

+Coming up this week on May 4 & 5, the clergy involved with our parish family of St. Andrew, St. Mary of the Hills and St. Irenaeus will be gathering with other "clergy cohorts" to learn more about the move to Families of Parishes. It is local, to be held at St. John Vianney Parish in Shelby Twp.

Also concerning the family of parish movement, we are being asked to plan on some type of "sessions" to get to know our brothers and sisters from the other two parishes better. Some parishes have tried zoom meetings and presentations; for sure we will have a mass, gathering us all together – as best as possible, given COVID restrictions – to celebrate our family. The "union" officially takes place for we "Wave 1" parishes July 1st, so we will be busy this summer pulling things together. As I said before, "more to come" for all of us!

+We are quickly moving through the year, at least in my opinion! Let us continue to work toward bringing about an end to the pandemic, wearing our masks, social distancing, washing hands, getting our vaccinations, using hand sanitizers - and praying - and all the other things prescribed to help us keep safe and healthy! I thank you for your support and prayers for me personally, but in a special way for our parish community. Let us continue to look for ways to build up the Body of Christ! I look forward to seeing you in church!

Today, in the Gospel from St. John the Evangelist, Jesus professes,

I am the vine, you are the branches

In this beautiful imagery, Jesus represents the vine that produces the gift of life and salvation for His beloved disciples, the branches. In his First Letter, St. John urges us to follow Christ's directives and live in Him by loving one another. In the Acts of the Apostles, St. Paul shows us that faithful disciples are not afraid to witness *in the name of the Lord*. Jesus invites us into a personal relationship with Him through the Eucharist. If we open our hearts to this invitation, our joy cannot be contained. In turn, we will spread this joy



by proclaiming Jesus to those we encounter, planting seeds to bear "good fruit" for the Kingdom. Please remember to share your love of the Lord with those you meet.

May is the Month of Mary!

As the Mother of God, the Virgin Mary has a unique position among the saints, indeed, among all creatures. She is exalted, yet still one of us.

Redeemed by reason of the merits of her Son and united to Him by a close and indissoluble tie, she is endowed with the high office and dignity of being the Mother of the Son of God, by which account she is also the beloved daughter of the Father and the temple of the Holy Spirit. Because of this gift of sublime grace she far surpasses all creatures, both in heaven and on earth. At the same time, however, because she belongs to the offspring of Adam she is one with all those who are to be saved. (Lumen Gentium, no. 53)

Mary embraces God's will and freely chooses to cooperate with God's grace, thereby fulfilling a crucial role in God's plan of salvation. Throughout the centuries, the Church has turned to the Blessed Virgin in order to come closer to Christ. Many forms of piety toward the Mother of God developed that help bring us closer to her Son. In these devotions to Mary, "while the Mother is honored, the Son, through whom all things



have their being and in whom it has pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell, is rightly known, loved and glorified and . . . all His commands are observed." The Church honors her as the Mother of God, looks to her as a model of perfect discipleship, and asks for her prayers to God on our behalf.






