### On the Journey

+This Sunday's Scriptures teach us about the sacramental covenant of marriage and how it is a reflection of God's covenant with his creation. It's a preparation for the eternal union all of us hope to enjoy with God in heaven. In Genesis, we see that God created man and woman for one another, that the two may become one flesh. Just as Adam and Eve names all God's creatures, parents have the opportunity to name their children, a name by which they will be referred to in this life and in the next.

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus quotes this same passage from Genesis when speaking about the unbreakable bond of marriage. When faced with the question of divorce, Jesus says it is the hardness of the human heart that brought about divorce, but the marriage bonds made by God can never be broken or undone. God never withdrew his covenant for Israel, no matter how unfaithful his chosen people became. Jesus tells us that, in the same way, we should never fail to love and forgive one another so the two who have become one in marriage may remain united until death.

In the Letter to the Hebrews, we heard that Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, helps us to become perfect through suffering. Married couples and parents bear crosses particular to their vocation, as do those who are not married or parents. If we can draw upon the grace of God to carry those crosses far, faithfully, and well for the glory of God and the good of others, then there is no offense that cannot be forgiven, and no wrong that cannot be made right.

Jesus reminds us to be childlike in our faith, accepting the kingdom of God like a little child so that one day we might enter into it. Children are quick to become angry, but almost as quick to forgive, forget, and move forward. The Lord reminds us to never lose and always cherish the awe and wonder with which children experience the world and others. That is where our faith can do the greatest good. Instead of seeing all that is wrong with the world, with ourselves, or with our marriages and our families, we can see what God sees through the eyes of mercy — the potential for holiness and greatness.

As Jesus said, what God has joined together, no human being may separate. It is the duty of each of us to see and serve Christ, for whom and through whom all things exist, by how we see, love, serve, and forgive one another. Then, as we recall how God's love for us in Christ has never failed us, we may draw strength from that to live in right relationship with Him and one another.

+As we move into October, we recall how this month is set aside as "Respect Life" month, a special time for all of us to reflect upon and give thanks for this precious gift of life bestowed on us. We pray in a most special way for an end to abortion. We pray, too, for a greater respect for life at all its stages – from conception to natural death. Euthanasia, human trafficking, human rights violations, and the many other

May we ask our Blessed Lady to intercede to her Son for us, as we honor her during this month of the Holy Rosary. And that leads me to remind everyone of a special parish rosary to be prayed on Sunday evening, October 10, at 6:30 p.m. May Mary help us in our task to keep ALL life sacred!

### **Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time**

In the framework of the reading from the Letter to the Hebrews: ... for whom and through whom all things exist through God, today's Scripture readings from the Book of Genesis and St. Mark's Gospel promote the common theme of sacred marriage. In the Gospel, Jesus, referencing Genesis, proclaims, God made them male and female. For this reason, a man shall leave his father and

mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. It is clear from these Scripture readings that God's blessing

of marriage is the union between one man and one woman. This is God's teaching on Christian marriage. It is this Scriptural Truth, this Church teaching, that faithful stewards must embrace to counter secular society's law, which professes a false image of marriage. In this Truth, the Sacrament of Matrimony accomplishes its full Christian meaning and potential by strengthening husbands and wives to love and serve the Lord and one another. ### St. Francis of Assisi

St. Francis was born in Assisi, the son of a wealthy merchant. In his youth, Francis lived a rich and easy life, but he wanted to be a knight. He went to battle seeking glory and prestige and was captured for ransom. During his captivity, according to legend, he began to have visions from God. After being freed, Francis returned a different man. Francis' conversion did not happen overnight. He spent more time in prayer and while at a small church in San Damiano, he heard God's call to rebuild the Church and live a life of poverty. Francis gave up his wealth in favor of a simpler life in Christ.

He began to beg and preach, attracting others who wanted to know how his life could be filled with such joy. His followers became known as Franciscan Friars. Francis practiced true equality, showing respect to everyone. Much is written about his love of nature. Francis felt that all God's creatures were part of his brotherhood.

His feast day is celebrated on October 4. He is considered the founder of all Franciscan orders and the patron saint of animals, archaeologists, ecology, Italy, merchants, messengers, and metal workers.

Those who will exclude any of God's creatures from the shelter of compassion and pity will deal likewise with their fellow man. – St. Francis of Assisi

### Faith Sharing at Home

The things that we are most passionate about seem to seep into our daily conversation. Here is a great example; my husband has a huge love of fly fishing. He reads books, has learned to tie flies and even practices casting in the backyard. In the past 7 years I can honestly say some reference to fishing has been a part of our weekly if not daily lives. I'm sure you could apply this same type of devotion to other hobbies; golf, soccer and gardening to name a few . People dive deep



into their pastime activities and want to share their passions with others, especially families and friends.

We all like to say, "God first, family second, then work etc. etc." However we need to put some thought into that ordered list. We should work at incorporating faith talk into our daily conversations. What does this look like? It can be as simple as a quick prayer before a meal...if breakfast is the only meal time together, pray then, it's not just for dinner. Practice prayers while your kids brush their teeth, or when they arrive home after school, wash their hands while saying the Our Father. One Catechist a few years back started her "high energy" class of all boys with a "plank and pray" ritual. Before they go to bed, ask them to tell you one thing they can thank God for today, then you share one too!

As a parent subscribe to a daily devotion via email, Instagram or Facebook. Then share the quotes, ideas and thoughts you glean from them with your family. Daily devotional books are a great resource also.

In addition to working your faith into daily conversations, it is also important to live it out. You talk about the importance of forgiveness then snub your grouchy neighbor. Guess what kids see? St. Francis of Assisi has the best quote, "Preach the Gospel often and when necessary use words." Children MUST see us acting out our faith. Our faith is meant to guide us on all our decisions from the products we buy, the way we treat a stranger, to forgiveness of a betrayal. Put God first, with conversation and deeds, then watch your faith grow.


# Do you have 2 to 3 hours a month to spend with someone who is lonely??

### **Our Common Home**

"Accordingly, as leaders of our Churches, we call on everyone, whatever their belief or worldview, to endeavor to listen to the cry of the earth and of people who are poor, examining their behavior and pledging meaningful sacrifices for the sake of the earth which God has given us." Pope Francis, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, and Archbishop of Canterbury Justin, A Joint Message for the Protection of Creation made on September 1, 2021, World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation

### **Pope Francis:**

On the final day of the Season of Creation and Feast Day of St. Francis of Assisi, October 4, Pope Francis will convene scientists and leaders of the world's religions at the Vatican to draft a statement urging significant climate protection action from global leaders at the UN COP26 climate summit in November.

Pope Francis will also travel to Glasgow, Scotland, during COP26 to urge world leaders to take urgent action.

### The Global Catholic Church:

Also on October 4, the Vatican is set to fully launch the **Laudato Si' Action Platform**, a global initiative to place Catholic institutions large and small—including families, parishes and dioceses, schools, businesses and farms, religious congregations, and health care facilities, on a seven-year path to sustainability. The platform urges participants to create and implement action plans that address eight specific goals for better caring for our common home.
